Dear Chairs Edwards, Howell, Herring, and Torian:

Virginia Code § 16.1-69.10 provides that the Committee on District Courts shall make a study and report to the General Assembly on the number of district court judges needed and the districts for which they shall be authorized. As you are aware, in December 2017, the Executive Committee of the Committee on District Courts adopted the National Center for State Court's report and recommendations contained in the 2017 Virginia Judicial Workload Assessment Report. Based on the recommendations in the Report, the number of judicial positions in the districts authorized in Va. Code § 16.1-69.6:1 was amended and became effective July 1, 2018. In addition, in 2018, the Committee on District Courts recommended the authorization of one new general district court judgeship in the 19th Judicial District of Virginia, which the General Assembly authorized effective July 1, 2020.

Notwithstanding the newly authorized judgeship in the 19th Judicial District, the assessments and recommended number of judgeships made in the Report remain pertinent. The Committee on District Courts does not recommend the creation of new judgeships this year but encourages the filling of the current and announced vacancies set forth in the enclosed document.
