Preface

This report has been prepared in accordance with and fulfills the requirements of:

§ 10.1-1020(B) of the Code of Virginia (Virginia Land Conservation Foundation), which requires the Foundation to conduct a grant round each year to identify and rank projects for the subsequent fiscal year and provide copies of such project rankings to the Chairmen of the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance by December 15 of each year. This report includes the ranking of those projects submitted during a request for proposals held from September 22 through October 30, 2020.

There is no funding associated with this request for proposals and ranking of projects. This report includes a listing of potential projects to illustrate the current financial need for land conservation. Should funding be provided in the Fiscal Year 2022 Appropriations Act, then the Virginia Land Conservation Foundation will conduct an official and comprehensive grant round in Calendar Year 2021 to award the available state funds.

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Pre-Application Grant Round Overview

Chapter 539 of the 2019 Virginia Acts of Assembly established a new requirement for the Virginia Land Conservation Foundation (VLCF) to hold a grant round each year to identify and rank projects for the subsequent fiscal year, and to provide copies of such project rankings to the Chairmen of the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance.

VLCF solicited proposals for land conservation projects from September 22 through October 30, 2020, to identify and rank them for this report. In these five weeks, a total of 61 applications were received, requesting \$79.5 million to conserve 32,166 acres across Virginia.

For this process, the VLCF Board adopted abbreviated scoring criteria for each of the five grant categories (see Appendix A). The Board established this simplified criteria based on the more in-depth Fiscal Year 2021 VLCF grant manual to facilitate submission and ranking of the applications. Applicants were asked to submit land conservation proposals and to indicate a grant category for each project submitted. The pre-applications were reviewed and evaluated against the criteria for the chosen category. A ranked list from highest to lowest score was then tabulated for all of the projects submitted in each of the five different categories (see Ranking of Pre-Application Projects Received by Grant Category below).

Virginia Land Conservation Foundation grant funds are allocated by category pursuant to the formulas set out in subsections (C) and (D) of § 10.1-1020 the Code of Virginia. First, 25 percent of the budgeted total is transferred to the Virginia Outdoors Foundation's Open-Space Lands Preservation Trust Fund. The remaining 75 percent is divided equally among the following grant categories if the budgeted total is less than \$10 million: (i) farmlands and forest preservation; (ii) historic area preservation; (iii) natural area protection; and (iv) open spaces and parks. However, if the budgeted total is \$10 million or more, then the remaining 75 percent of funds are divided equally among five grant categories, with farmland preservation and forestland preservation each as their own category instead of sharing one funding category.

In 2020, due to budget uncertainties caused by the pandemic, the Foundation also began the Fiscal Year 2021 VLCF grant round on September 22, 2020, with \$4.5 million of funding. Applications for this grant round are due by November 30, 2020. The Foundation is expected to meet in January 2021 to award grants to those projects that rank the highest in each grant category. Because the reconvened Session finalized an appropriation of \$10 million for VLCF, the Foundation will also start another grant round for the remaining \$5.5 million in early 2021.

The following pages include the rankings of the pre-applications received in 2020. The pre-application grant manual is included as Appendix A.

I. PRE-APPLICATION GRANT ROUND OVERVIEW

<u>Chapter 539 of the 2019 Virginia Acts of Assembly</u> set out a new process for conducting land conservation grant rounds offered by the Virginia Land Conservation Foundation (the Foundation or VLCF) established in 1999 under Va. Code §§ 10.1-1017 through 10.1-1026.

This Pre-application Grant Round is being conducted to generate a ranked list of potential land conservation projects to be provided by the Chairman of the Board of Trustees to the Chairman of the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance by December 15, 2020.

This Pre-application Grant Manual and the process described herein is intended to generate project proposals that will be ranked and form the required list to be reported to the General Assembly.

Should grant funding be provided in the state budget for fiscal year 2022, then the VLCF Board will hold a full grant round to award those funds during calendar year 2021. The request for proposals will be open to all eligible applicants, including those who submit pre-applications for this process and those who did not.

II. SUBMITTING POTENTIAL PROJECTS

Applicants are requested to submit potential land conservation projects for consideration by submitting the Pre-application Information Packet (PIP) and requested information as described below.

Pre-application Information Packet (PIP)

The following items make up the PIP. Only these listed items should be submitted.

- 1) The **Pre-application Information Form** and requested information (found at the end of this grant manual).
- 2) An **aerial map** depicting the boundaries of the proposed project.
- 3) A USGS 7.5' **topographic map** showing the boundaries of the proposed project and any perennial streams or rivers as depicted by a solid blue line.
- 4) Pictures of the property, including photographs of the primary conservation values and resources to be protected.

Pre-application Submission and Deadline

A valid pre-application submission includes a searchable <u>electronic version of the entire Pre-application Information Packet</u> (in searchable PDF format). This must be delivered to the Department of Conservation and Recreation <u>no later than 4 p.m. on Friday, October 30, 2020</u>. Important Program Information

 Pre-applications may be submitted by state agencies, localities, other public bodies, and registered (tax-exempt) nonprofit organizations that qualify as a holder under Va. Code § 10.1-1009. Projects may be either acquisitions of property in fee simple or conservation or open-space easements.

- Pre-applications must be for land conservation projects whereby the landowner has already been engaged and for which specific properties (tax parcels) are being sought for acquisition or conservation or open-space easements.
- Proposals must be for a minimum of \$20,000 in total expense or a possible grant request of no less than \$10,000.
- When preparing a pre-application the following should be considered:
 - ♦ VLCF can fund the purchase of property in fee, or the purchase of a conservation easement to protect the property's conservation values.
 - ♦ VLCF can pay up to 50% of costs associated with the project (100% for state agencies).
 - The pre-application must be for **specific property** and clearly identified in the proposal.
 - ♦ VLCF requires 35' permanent vegetated buffers that may be mowed one time per calendar year or 100' vegetated buffers that may be mowed three times per year, on all perennial streams, rivers, shorelines, or bodies of water with perennial outflow.
 - Properties in a proposal submitted by a non-profit entity must be protected by an easement held or co-held by a public body.
 - If match property is being considered rather than a cash match, the property must be geographically or ecologically connected to the subject property.

Pre-application Scoring Categories

Pre-applications may be submitted under one of the five following scoring categories.

- 1. Farmlands Preservation
- 2. Forest Preservation
- 3. Historic Area Preservation
- 4. Natural Area Preservation
- 5. Open Spaces and Parks

As set out in Va. Code § 10.1-1020 (C)(2), farmlands and forest preservation share a funding category if less than \$10 million is appropriated for a regular VLCF grant round. While this is usually a single funding category, separate criteria have been developed for agricultural lands and for forestal lands. The applicant should use the set of criteria that is most appropriate for the project being submitted.

Pre-application Review and Scoring

Pre-applications will be reviewed and evaluated under the chosen category as indicated on the application. The scores in this process are predominantly based on mapped data and information available on the Department of Conservation and Recreation's Natural Heritage Data Explorer:

<u>https://vanhde.org/</u>. This site includes the publicly accessible ConserveVirginia Map and the Virginia Conservation Vision map layers. Other project information will also be considered as specified under each category.

Please be sure to answer all of the questions in the Pre-application Information Form for your chosen category and the additional water quality points on page 7.

Scoring for each category is based on the criteria below. The maximum score for a project is 90 points (60 points for the chosen category plus 30 additional points for water quality criteria). Project boundaries submitted by applicants will be reviewed using maps of conservation priority resources to score the applications.

Farmlands Preservation (60 points max)

- ConserveVirginia: Agriculture and Forestry Category [20 points]
- Soil Productivity: Percent of soils classified as Prime, Unique and Important multiplied by 25 [up to 25 points]
- Adjacent to Conserved Lands [5 points]
- Best Management Practices: Are BMPs being implemented on the subject property [10 points]

Forest Preservation (60 points max)

- ConserveVirginia: Agriculture and Forestry Category [20 points]
- Acreage: 0.5 point for every 50 acres [up to 10 points]
- Percent Forested: percent forested multiplied by 10 [up to 10 points]
- Percent High Conservation Value: FCV 4 and 5 percentage multiplied by 15 [up to 15 points]
- Adjacent to Conserved Land [5 points]

Historic Area Preservation (60 points max)

- Conserve Virginia: Cultural and Historic Preservation Category [20 points]
- Historic Significance: Listed or determined by DHR to be eligible for listing on the Virginia Landmarks Register (25 points); battlefield property identified with a priority rating in one of the following reports issued by the National Park Service's American Battlefield Protection Program: 'Report on the Nation's Civil War Battlefields" (1993, as amended), or "Report to Congress on the Historic Preservation of Revolutionary War and War of 1812 Sites in the United States," (2007, as amended) (25 points); and designated as a National Historic Landmark (10 points) [up to 35 points]
- Adjacent to Conserved Lands [up to 5 points]

Natural Area Preservation (60 points max)

- ConserveVirginia: Natural Habitat & Ecosystem Diversity Category [20 points]
- Biodiversity Significance: Within a Natural Heritage Conservation Site (20 points); Natural Heritage elements present (e.g. rare plant or animal species populations, exemplary natural communities, or unique geologic features) (10 points); Biodiversity rank of Conservation Site indicating global significance (5 points) [up to 35 points]
- Adjacent to Conserved Lands/Connectivity: Is the parcel adjacent to other conservation lands with Biodiversity Management Intent (BMI)? [5 points]

Open Spaces and Parks (60 points max)

- ConserveVirginia: Any category of ConserveVirginia and daily public access [20 points]
- Public Access to State Waters [10 points]
- A new public recreational opportunity [10 points]
- Scenic Resources Identified and Protected [5 points]
- Benefitting an underserved population [10 points]
- Adjacent to Parks and Conserved Lands [5 points]

Additional Water Quality Points for all Categories (30 points max)

- Is the project within the Floodplains and Floodplain Resilience Category or the Water Quality Improvement Category of ConserveVirginia? [10 points]
- Are there perennial streams, rivers, shoreline, or bodies of water on the property that will have permanent vegetated buffers excluding livestock that are 100 feet in width? [10 points]
- Will the permanent vegetated buffers be forested? [10 points]
