Ladies and Gentleman:

I am writing to report on the Virginia Investment Performance (VIP) and Major Eligible Employer (MEE) grants that were awarded during the fourth quarter of the 2019 calendar year as required by § 2.2-5103(D) of the Code of Virginia.

In the fourth quarter, ending December 31, 2019, two VIP grants were awarded. No MEE grants were awarded in the fourth quarter of 2019.

Virginia Investment Performance:

- 1. **DuPont**, located in Chesterfield County, is a manufacturer of next-generation Kevlar. Awarded a \$1,000,000 grant, the company will be making a \$110.5 million investment and creating 60 new jobs by December 31, 2021. This project has been announced.
- 2. Flowers Foods, located in the City of Lynchburg, is a commercial bakery. Awarded a \$250,000 grant, the company will be making a \$25 million investment and creating 15 new jobs by December 31, 2022. This project has been announced.
