### **Annual Report on State Jobs Eliminated Due to Privatization**

Section 2.2-203.2:1, Code of Virginia, requires the Secretary of Administration to report to the Governor and the General Assembly on the number of state jobs eliminated in the immediately preceding fiscal year due to the privatization of commercial activities to a commercial source.

"Commercial activities" means an activity performed by or for state government that is not an inherently governmental activity and that may feasibly be obtained from a commercial source at lower cost than the activity being performed by state employees. "Commercial source" means any business or other concern that is eligible for a contract award in accordance with the Virginia Public Procurement Act (§ 2.2-4300 et seq.).

Agencies reported to the Department of Human Resource Management that the following seven positions were privatized during fiscal year 2021:

- Thomas Nelson Community College reported privatizing five Housekeeping and/or Apparel Worker I, and one Housekeeping and/or Apparel Manager I to Thompson Services (a franchise of ServiceMaster Cleaning), resulting in six separation – layoffs.
- The Department of Corrections, State Farm Complex reported privatizing one Trades Technician III to CGL Facility Management LLC, resulting in one separation– Enhanced Retirement.
