During the first two quarters of fiscal year 2022, 3,605 requests for waivers of statutory fee caps were submitted seeking a total of \$2,367,460, and 3,468 requests for waivers were approved for a total of \$2,096,560 paid to court-appointed attorneys above the initial statutory fee cap.
