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WVPEC's fiscal year coincides with school years (July 1 through June 30). Unless indicated otherwise, the information contained herein pertains to fiscal year July 2020 – June 2021.

Executive Summary

Mission and Purpose of WVPEC as of July 1, 2020:

WVPEC is composed of twenty-three school divisions in western Virginia that include Alleghany, Bath, Bland, Botetourt, Carroll, Covington, Craig, Culpeper, Danville, Floyd, Franklin, Giles, Grayson, Henry, Martinsville, Montgomery, Patrick, Pulaski, Radford City, Roanoke City, Roanoke County, Salem City, and Wythe County Public Schools. Galax City Public Schools joined the consortium in November 2020 bringing the total to twenty-four school divisions. WVPEC's goal is to support educational programming and student success in each of these school divisions and throughout the region, by sponsoring professional development programs as well as holding a job fair to recruit teachers to fill vacancies in The Consortium school districts. School divisions are required to pay student fees and job fair fees for the Consortium to be operational.

The school superintendents and representatives from Virginia Tech and Radford University form the Governing Board of this legislatively approved organization. An Executive Committee of six elected superintendents (listed below) oversees and supports the organization through monthly meetings in Radford. Day-to-day operations of WVPEC are overseen and supported by an Executive Director and an Executive Assistant, both of whom are part-time employees. WVPEC accounts are reviewed and results are shared with the WVPEC Governing Board during their semi-annual meeting.

Major WVPEC projects/initiatives completed this year:

- <u>The Virginia School Leaders Institute (VSLI)</u>. A year-long institute, with participants meeting at the Hotel Roanoke for four 3-day workshops, the VSLI for Recently Appointed Administrators commenced in October 2005 and is a joint effort with Virginia Tech. Based on the ISLLC standards for school leaders, the School Leaders Institute is a researched-based professional development activity for newly appointed administrators. Consortium Members receive a discount.
- <u>High School Senior Exit and Graduate Follow-up Surveys.</u> Each spring, high school seniors in the WVPEC region's high schools have available an online survey if the school district elects to use it. Results are sent to each school superintendent detailing his/her graduating seniors' perceptions of their high school experiences.
- <u>The WVPEC Regional Teacher Recruitment Job Fair</u>. WVPEC holds a regional teacher recruitment fair each year which has drawn as many as 500 applicants. The Job Fair is held each year in January/February in Salem, Virginia, a central location in our region. Due to the Coronovirus-19 Pandemic the annual job fair was held virtually using Career Fair Plus. Each candidates logged into the system and completed an on-line application. That information was compiled by the provider and WVPEC dispersed that information to be used by Human Resource departments in WVPEC divisions.

• <u>Professional Development</u>. At the request of the consortium districts, in the spring of 2011, WVPEC has organized Professional Development programs. Starting in June 2011 through June 2021, WVPEC has hosted 51 Professional Development workshop/

conferences with attendees from many districts across the Commonwealth (both WVPEC and non-WVPEC members). During 2020-2021, WVPEC held 4 workshops/conferences with over 240 registered. In March of 2020 all face-to-face gatherings were halted due to the Coronavirus-19 Pandemic. As a result all the Professional Development programs were held virtually via zoom. By June enough assembly restrictions were lifted so the 4th Annual Virginia School Administrators Hot Topics Conference was held in person.

WVPEC will continue its plan to hold at least three to five Professional Development conferences, the annual Teacher Recruitment Job Fair, and the Hot Topics Conference for administrators.
