In accordance with Chapter 1024, enactment clause 2, of the 2004 Acts of Assembly, please find below information on the number of petitions for writs of actual innocence filed pursuant to Chapter 19.3 of Title 19.2, and the dispositions thereof, for calendar year 2021.

- Twelve petitions were pending on January 1, 2021.
- Thirty-seven petitions were filed in 2021.
- Twenty-eight petitions were disposed of in 2021. The dispositions of those cases were as follows:
 - Twenty-one petitions were summarily dismissed.
 - Seven petitions were dismissed following consideration of the Attorney General's response to the petition and petitioner's reply thereto, if any.
 - No petitions were dismissed following consideration of the Attorney General's response to the petition and petitioner's reply thereto, if any, and the circuit court's findings of fact.
 - No writs were issued, and the convictions vacated.
- Twenty-one petitions are pending as of December 31, 2021.

Amendments to the actual innocence statutes went into effect on July 1, 2020, in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic. It is anticipated that the filing of actual innocence petitions will increase significantly in the future.
