During the first three quarters of fiscal year 2023, 5,801 requests for waivers of statutory fee caps were submitted seeking a total of \$4,095,420, and 5,628 requests for waivers were approved for a total of \$3,812,000 paid to court-appointed attorneys above the initial statutory fee cap. A breakdown of the waivers requested by category of offense charged and type of offender is provided in the table below.
