Dear Co-Chairwoman Howell, Co-Chairman Barker, and Chairman Knight:

Enclosed is the report required by Item 61F of the enacted biennial budget requiring the Office of the Attorney General (“OAG”) to submit a report “detailing expenditures in the prior fiscal year for special outside counsel by any executive branch agencies” including “the reasoning why outside counsel is necessary, the hourly rate charged by outside counsel, total expenditures, and funding source.” The attached report covers all of the items requested for fiscal year 2022 (July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022).

Virginia Code § 2.2-507 requires that “all legal service in civil matters for the Commonwealth, the Governor, and every state department, institution, division, commission, board, bureau, agency, entity, official, court, or judge, including the conduct of all civil litigation in which any of them are interested, shall be rendered and performed by the Attorney General,

except as provided in this chapter and except for any litigation concerning a justice or judge initiated by the Judicial Inquiry and Review Commission.” Virginia Code §§ 2.2-507 and 2.2-510 authorize the Attorney General to engage and manage the engagement of outside counsel in certain circumstances when “it is impracticable or uneconomical for the Attorney General's office to render such service.” Accordingly, with regard to the requirement to provide reasoning for engagement of outside counsel, I note here that, unless otherwise indicated, the reason for engagements described in the report is that it was “impracticable or uneconomical for the Attorney General's office to render such service.”

The most common circumstances that make it either impracticable or uneconomical for the OAG to provide legal services and therefore necessitate the engagement of outside counsel are the lack of certain specialized or unique legal expertise among the OAG staff or the lack of legal staff in the geographic location where services are necessary.

The majority of outside counsel work is performed under engagements procured competitively pursuant to “Solicitations for Proposals” (SFPs) in which firms bid for the opportunity to provide legal services, resulting in a slate of pre-approved firms that provide legal services at discounted, guaranteed rates negotiated by the OAG. Selection as a qualified provider under an SFP is not a guarantee of work. The attached report details each agency that received services during fiscal year 2022 and the cost of those services pursuant to current or previous SFP categories, as well as the hourly rate range for each of the categories. As indicated in the report, the highest billed SFP categories are Eminent Domain (22.88%), General Civil Litigation (19.34%), and University Medical Centers (10.22%).

Outside counsel may also be engaged to provide legal services for Commonwealth agencies on a “Single Case Appointment” (SCA) basis for one specific transaction, issue, or matter that is either not covered by an existing SFP category or requires expertise or exists in a jurisdiction beyond that maintained by firms engaged pursuant to a relevant SFP category. The attached report details each agency that received services pursuant to an SCA during fiscal year 2022, the cost of those services, as well as the hourly rate range and a brief description for each SCA.


The Office of the Attorney General manages the relationship with all outside counsel to include establishing the scope of legal services, terms and conditions of engagement, outside counsel directives, and other governing documents; negotiating rates and establishing matter budgets; monitoring performance to ensure the Commonwealth and its agencies receive excellent service; reviewing invoices to ensure compliance with established procedures and monitoring billing practices. As dictated by state law, unless otherwise indicated, the legal services described in the report were “paid out of the funds appropriated for the administration of the board, commission, division, or department represented or whose members, officers, inspectors, investigators, or other employees are represented.”

The Office of the Attorney General is committed to engaging outside counsel who can provide competent and cost-effective service to the Commonwealth and its agencies. It is the goal of the OAG to closely monitor outside counsel with an eye toward improving coordination,

oversight, effectiveness, and efficiency and cost-effectiveness. We have expanded the services covered by the SFP categories, updated the governing policies for the outside counsel program, provided training opportunities to OAG staff and outside counsel attorneys and staff, improved recordkeeping, cross-trained OAG employees to mitigate lapses in coordination, and requested and received feedback from agencies on the services they receive.

I am proud to lead a team that provides exceptional legal service on such a broad scope of issues, often of great depth, complexity, and significance. It is a truly remarkable team. The attorneys in the Office of Attorney General are dedicated professionals who, in many cases, are sacrificing more lucrative opportunities in the private sector to serve our Commonwealth. On the occasions when the people of Virginia are best served by the engagement of outside counsel, I will make sure the Commonwealth gets maximum value for each and every dollar.
