Dear Governor Youngkin and Chairs Howell, Barker, and Knight:

Virginia Code § 19.2-163 requires the Executive Secretary to report to the Governor, members of the House Appropriations Committee and members of the Senate Finance and Appropriations Committee, on a quarterly basis, "the number and category of offenses charged involving adult and juvenile offenders in cases in which courtappointed counsel is assigned" and "the amounts paid by waiver above the initial cap to court-appointed counsel."

The following table details the vouchers submitted for compensation by courtappointed counsel during fiscal year 2023 and reflects the number and category of offenses charged involving adult and juvenile offenders:

During fiscal year 2023, 7,750 requests for waivers of statutory fee caps were submitted seeking a total of \$5,541,814 and 7,542 requests for waivers were approved for a total of \$5,125,126 paid to court-appointed attorneys above the initial statutory fee cap.
