Mary Baldwin University and The Commonwealth of Virginia's Virginia Women's Institute for Leadership

Our nation's only all-female corps of cadets (report date September 1, 2023)

VWIL proudly continues 28 years serving the best interests of the United States of America and the Commonwealth of Virginia. VWIL is the nation's premier college leadership development program for women, integrating academics, fitness, leadership development, ethics, and military training. The program demands of cadets a great deal beyond the ordinary, its educational value is stronger than ever, and it produces exceptional citizens and military leaders.

Virginia Women's Institute for Leadership Facts:

- The General Assembly requires this annual report on the number of students participating in the Virginia Women's Leadership Program (75 students in 2023-24), the number of in-state (20) and out-of-state (0) students receiving awards, the amount of the awards (equivalent to VTAG), the number of students graduating (24 in 2024), and the number of students receiving commissions in the military (10 in 2024). Ref: SB800, Item 144 and HB1400, Item 144.
- Budget Language Request from Virginia Private Colleges would remove the inequitable barrier to Virginia's female VWIL cadets by providing them access to VTAG. Current appropriation and budget language related to VWIL at Mary Baldwin University restricts female cadets from receiving VTAG. This change will instill confidence and enable VWIL to positively invest the full appropriation \$307,899.00 of general fund support toward urgent program needs for these future leaders. This funding will help replace aging transportation to weekly ROTC courses totaling over 30K miles a semester; design and update VWIL's 29-year-old Class A uniform jacket; and cover VWIL's operating budget to include advanced experiential leadership development seminars and career preparedness.
- In 2023–24, the VWIL Corps is comprised of 61% minority students. No other senior military college or military academy represents such a diverse population by percentage VWIL's diversity is our strength.
- Mary Baldwin University awards this Virginia VWIL financial incentive to only Virginia cadets. In the past 10 years, those awards totaled: 2013, 56 students; 2014, 52 students; 2015, 46 students; 2016, 39 students; 2017, 39 students; 2018, 35 students; 2019, 42 students; 2020, 28 students; 2021, 28 students; 2022, 21 students; and in 2023 we have 20 students from Virginia.
- Under the leadership of Brigadier General Terry Djuric (USAF, Retired), VWIL's national reputation has grown, and our incoming freshmen classes average 70% out-of-state students from 19 states who do not benefit from the Virginia VWIL grant. The Commonwealth of Virginia's annual allocation in the state budget is essential and directly supports cadets with dedicated leadership programming. The VWIL program administrative costs have been reduced while providing quality leadership development for the VWIL cadets –women leaders who believe in diversity, truth, duty, honor.
- To date, 502 VWIL women have graduated from Mary Baldwin University; 45% of these graduates were Virginians, 40% were first-generation college students, and 56% pursued government careers at the local, state, national and international levels. Over the past 25 years of graduates, we've commissioned 180 officers and an additional 16 enlisted into the U.S. armed forces; and our commissioning rate averaged 57% between 2019 and 2023.
- VWIL is a successful public-private partnership of the Commonwealth of Virginia and Mary Baldwin University, established in 1995 at the Commonwealth's request. The Virginia Corps of Cadets consists of VMI, VT, and VWIL. Historically, VWIL has represented 5% of the total Virginia Corps and 30% of the women in the Virginia Corps.
