## Sales Highlights

October highlights include the end of the most recent significant Powerball jackpot run, with one winning ticket sold in California for an estimated \$1.76 billion jackpot. For October, scratcher sales were down compared to the same month last year, when the Lottery introduced its first \$50 scratcher game. Overall, cumulative sales were up over 25% compared to the same period last year. Sales of iLottery Instants continue to be strong, up 64% compared to last year.

#### **Profit Highlights**

October monthly profits were also strong, although lower than last year mainly due to higher prize payout rates for the daily draw games. For the year to date, profits are 13% or \$36 million higher than last year. Other income, comprised mainly of interest earnings on cash balances, is higher due to higher cash balances and interest earnings rates. Retailer earnings and the overall retailer earnings rate continue to lag compared to last year.

#### Other Highlights

The annual Virginia's New Year's Millionaire Raffle is on sale at retailers across the Commonwealth. There are 625,000 tickets available for sale. This popular annual game will make five lucky ticket holders a millionaire to start the 2024 year. In addition to those million-dollar prizes, players also have the chance to win \$100,000 or \$500 prizes.

Virginia Lottery employees are having winning experiences by supporting our communities through the Lottery Outreach Program, including Habitat for Humanity and the Chesterfield Food Bank most recently. Employees also are participating in the annual Commonwealth of Virginia Campaign through a variety of activities including a cornhole tournament, chili cook-off and bake sale, and a silent auction.

Finally, we wrapped up the submission period for our 7<sup>th</sup> annual Thank a Teacher Art Contest. We look forward to selecting three winning designs from talented K-12 public school student artists to be featured on thank-you notes that will be distributed to public school teachers during National Teacher Appreciation Week next spring. We will award the winning students early next year and, once scheduled, will share dates of those surprise presentations in the event anyone from the administration would like to join us.
