# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Section 22.1-24.1 of the Code of Virginia provides that the Superintendent of Public Instruction "shall establish and appoint members of the Internet Safety Advisory Council (the Council) for the purpose of advancing the goal of safe use of media and technology by students and teachers in public elementary and secondary schools in the Commonwealth." The statute sets out the membership of the Council. This section of Code was added by Chapter 776 during the 2022 General Assembly. Chapter 111 (2023 Acts of Assembly) amended this section to add that the Council may collaborate with law-enforcement agencies, criminal justice agencies, and other nongovernmental organizations with expertise in child online safety issues and human trafficking prevention. The statute is in effect until July 1, 2024.

### The duties of the Council include:

- Developing recommendations to the Board of Education for adoption, a model policy for local school boards that would enable them to better support the Internet safety of all students and teachers;
- Developing recommendations to the Board of Education for adoption, model instructional practices for and instructional content on the safe use of media and technology by students and teachers; and
- Designing and posting on the Department's website a page with links to successful instructional practices, curricula, and other teacher resources.

The Council met on September 18th, 2023, October 16th, 2023, and November 20th 2023.

During the September meeting of the Council, advisors shared their backgrounds and expertise on internet safety in relationship to the K-12 education system. The chair of the council, Calypso

Gilstrap, reviewed Section <u>22.1-24.1</u> of the Code of Virginia. Next the chair led the group through a presentation on the background, initiatives, regulations, and existing laws related to Internet Safety which are in place in Virginia. The meeting ended with the expectation that advisors would be prepared to share resources related to the directive of the legislation at the October meeting.

The October meeting was designated as time for advisors to share curated resources with the council. Each member was given time to present any resource they felt addressed the needs established in Section 22.1-24.1. The group also reviewed the resources which were curated by the Digital Citizenship, Internet Safey, and Media Literacy Council which meet with the Office of Educational Technology from 2019-2022. In total, more than 200 resources were shared, discussed, and added to a bibliography.

The most recent meeting in November was an opportunity for advisors to share curated resources. These resources were added to the bibliography created in October. The group segued into a discussion on the creation of a selection criteria. The group determined utilizing Dig Cit Commit Competencies created by ISTE is the standard in which the Virginia Department of Education shall use to evaluate, align, and organize internet safety resources for educators and students. Lastly, the group began a discussion on the guidelines which they would like to see in the model policy.

The next meeting is scheduled for January 8th, 2024. Once the Council concludes its meetings in the spring, recommendations will be taken to the Board of Education for consideration.
