This report is submitted in compliance with the Virginia Acts of the Assembly – <u>Appropriation</u> Act - Item 291 G. (Special Session I, 2022), which states:

Appropriation Act - Item 291 G. (Special Session I, 2022)

The Virginia Department of Health shall report for each month within 30 days after the end of each month, on the number of procedures approved for payment pursuant to § 32.1-92.2, Code of Virginia, and include a description of the nature of the fetal abnormality, to the extent permitted by law, as required for eligibility under § 32.1-92.2, Code of Virginia. The department shall report the information by letter to the Chairmen of the House Appropriations and Senate Finance and Appropriations Committees.

The Virginia Appropriation Act - Item 291 G.
