**SUBJECT:** Update on the Virginia Military Survivors and Dependents Education

Program – Stipend awards

The Virginia Acts of Assembly, Chapter 1, 2023, requires that the State Council of Higher Education receive reports of eligible students from public institutions of higher education for the Virginia Military Survivors and Dependent Education Program - Stipend. Specifically, Item 142.E. states as follows:

4. Each institution of higher education shall report the number of recipients for this program to the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia by April 1 of each year. The State Council of Higher Education for Virginia shall report this information to the Chairmen of the House Appropriations and Senate Finance Committees by May 15 of each year.

By way of reminder, the enclosed table presents the use of the VMSDEP stipend and does not reflect usage of the VMSDEP tuition waiver, which carries both higher usage and higher costs. The VMSDEP stipend is available to students meeting the requirements under Tier 2 only. Tier 1 recipients are dependents of veterans whose disability occurred due to service-related injuries, while Tier 2 recipients are

dependents of veterans whose injuries occurred due to military operations against terrorism, on a peacekeeping mission, as a result of a terrorist act, or in any armed conflict.

In accordance with the stipend-reporting requirement, please find the attached report, which summarizes our findings. Please note that due to an ongoing student application review and acceptance process, the Department of Veterans Services (DVS) and public institutions of higher education continue to provide SCHEV with updated student eligibility reports throughout the month of May and SCHEV anticipates making summer awards. As of May 15, 2024, the records reflect a total of 4,800 recipients with \$7,384,751 combined in fall and spring term awards. These numbers are anticipated to grow slightly when summer awards are confirmed. The awards are funded by the \$7,680,000 appropriation for FY 2024.

This partial year report of 4,800 confirmed stipend awards represents a 40% increase over FY 2023 and continues a four-year growth trend as follows: FY 2021 - 13.7%, FY 2022 - 55.9%, FY 2023 - 37.5%, and FY 2024 - 40.1%, year-over-year. The current growth trend is anticipated to continue into the next biennium. Accordingly, SCHEV requested and was granted a \$2 million funding increase for the VMSDEP stipend award.
