### Year to Date Highlights

For the fiscal year, iLottery Instants continue to experience strong growth. Beginning in January, retail sales also began to show growth over the prior year, and with April's results, retail sales are now <u>up</u> from the prior year for the first time this fiscal year. In the first four months of calendar year 2024, strong retail sales have erased the \$54M FY24 year-to-date deficit as of December 2023. Overall profits are up 7% compared to last year, and nearly 9% stronger than the forecast. Profits in excess of the forecast will be transferred to the Lottery Proceeds Fund after final FY24 results are certified by the Auditor of Public Accounts on August 15, 2024. The 2024 Appropriation Act (Chapter 2) includes \$25M in anticipated surplus profits from this fiscal year, for distribution in FY25.

#### Other Highlights

We are pleased to report that we exceeded expectations for our annual Thank a Teacher campaign this year. After encouraging Virginians to thank as many public school teachers as possible leading up to National Teacher Appreciation Week, we facilitated the distribution of a record 135,000 thank-you notes! The notes, which feature designs from public school student artists, contain a code for teachers to enter for a chance to win cash prizes and supplies for their school. This year nearly 17,000 codes were entered, up from 6,700 in 2023. We look forward to surprising teachers in Bristol, Franklin County, Winchester and Northampton County with these prizes.
