

#### Background

During the 2020 Session of the Virginia General Assembly, policymakers enacted Article 14 of Chapter 1 of Title 9.1 of the *Code of Virginia*, establishing the Sexual Assault Forensic Examiner Coordination Program at the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS), effective July 1, 2020. The goals of the program, as outlined in *Code of Virginia* § 9.1-191, include developing and enhancing sexual assault forensic examiner programs across Virginia, establishing a partnership group to plan forensic nurse training, assisting with developing protocols and guidelines for the treatment of victims of sexual assault, and collecting and maintaining information on all available sexual assault forensic services in Virginia. The Sexual Assault Forensic Services Coordinator (Coordinator) at DCJS leads this program.

Code of Virginia § 9.1-191 also requires that the "Coordinator shall report annually on or before October 1 to the Governor and the General Assembly. The report shall include a summary of activities for the year and any recommendations to address sexual assault exams within the Commonwealth, including budget needs to increase the availability of sexual assault exam services across the Commonwealth."

#### **Activities**

The Coordinator has ten responsibilities outlined in the *Code of Virginia*. Current activities related to each responsibility are described below.

 Create and coordinate an annual statewide sexual assault forensic nurse examiner training program in partnership with the Attorney General, the Virginia Department of Health, the Virginia Hospital and Healthcare Association, the Victim Compensation Fund, the International Association of Forensic Nurses, and the Secretary of Health and Human Services.

The Coordinator created and coordinated an Adult/Adolescent Sexual Assault Nurse/Forensic Examiner Clinical Skills Lab (Lab) at Valley Urgent Care in Harrisonburg, Virginia, in partnership with the International Association of Forensic Nurses (IAFN), the Office of the Attorney General, the Virginia Department of Health, and the Virginia Victims Fund.

The purpose of the Lab, as stated in the IAFN curriculum document, is "to prepare the didactically trained SAFE/SANE [Sexual Assault Forensic Examiner/Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner] for clinical aspects of the adult/adolescent sexual assault medical-forensic examination, regardless of the provider's practice setting."<sup>1</sup>

Eleven nurses, who all had completed 40-hours of the Adult/Adolescent Didactic Training, attended the intensive and hands-on lab training. The training used the IAFN "Clinical Skills Lab Curriculum," as well as trainers and Gynecological Training Associates (GTA) contracted by the IAFN.

Three trainers and two GTA offered students opportunities to perform speculum exams on live simulation patients and practice trauma informed care in mock scenarios.

2. Coordinate the development and enhancement of sexual assault forensic examiner programs across the Commonwealth that include prevention of secondary trauma to survivors and culturally sensitive training for health professionals.

The Coordinator made in-person visits to Valley Urgent Care in Harrisonburg, Virginia and Augusta Health Forensic Nursing Services in Lexington, Virginia. Valley Urgent Care began providing forensic exams for both adults and pediatrics within the last year. The Harrisonburg area did not have forensic exam services available to children before Valley Urgent Care began offering these services.


The Coordinator provided resources and support to Virginia Hospital Center in Arlington, Virginia and Chesapeake Regional Healthcare. Neither of these hospitals currently have a sexual assault forensic nurse examiner program ("FNE program"), but they are exploring the possibility of creating one.

The Coordinator is collaborating with the DCJS Children's Justice Act Coordinator on the DCJS Child Abuse Telehealth Initiative. The primary focus of this telehealth project is to ensure that children in rural localities, who have experienced sexual abuse, are able to have forensic evidence collected within the federally defined timeframe. The Coordinator identified two areas in the state that did not offer pediatric forensic exams: Smyth and Washington Counties in Southwest Virginia and Harrisonburg in the Shenandoah Valley. DCJS is working with the Highlands Community Services Children's Advocacy Center and Valley Urgent Care to establish sustainable pediatric FNE programs in those localities.

# Forensic Nurse Examiner Programs Across the Commonwealth by the Numbers

There are 27 health systems listed as members of the Virginia Hospital and Healthcare Association, with a total of 111 hospitals.<sup>2</sup>

In July 2022, DCJS conducted a study of FNE programs across the Commonwealth and found that 14 health systems, with a total of 23 hospitals, have active forensic nursing programs.

In addition, Virginia has four programs that are not hospital-based. One of these programs is a pediatric forensic program with one part time nurse, operating out of an urgent care clinic.

The Coordinator has identified the following challenges to sustaining existing FNE programs and expanding FNE programs in Virginia:

a. The state reimbursements for forensic nursing exams increased in April 2022, but still do not cover all costs associated with the exams. The average cost of a Physical Evidence Recovery Kit (PERK) exam was \$3,934 in State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2022, which means that on average, Virginia covered only 40.67% of the cost of a PERK exam in SFY 2022 (Virginia Victims Fund Sexual Assault Forensic Exam (SAFE) Payment Program Data). Additionally, FNE programs are not reimbursed for the costs associated with the time nurses spend in court preparation and court testimony, so hospitals end up absorbing these unreimbursed costs.

The reimbursement rates are as follows: 3

Exam Type	Current Reimbursements Rates	Rates After Increase, Effective April 1, 2022
Acute Forensic Exam	\$1,200	\$1,600
Non-Acute Forensic Exam	\$800	\$1,000
Follow-up Forensic Exam	\$300	\$350

- b. Many hospital administrators/management do not know what a sexual assault forensic nurse does, or how their services fit into a healthcare framework. Sexual assaults are often not viewed as a public health issue, and sexual assault forensic nursing is not seen as an essential healthcare service.
- c. Lack of funding and/or support from hospital administration results in a lack of nurses pursuing forensic nursing as a career. With so few nurses in the field, this results in overworked and underpaid nurses with little incentive to remain in the field of forensic nursing.
- 3. Participate in the development of hospital protocols and guidelines for treatment of survivors of sexual assault in partnership with the Department of Health.

The Coordinator is in communication with staff from the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) and attended meetings of the Task Force on Services for Survivors of Sexual Assault (Task Force), coordinated by VDH. The Task Force is working on model and guidance documents for both adult and pediatric transfer and treatment of sexual assault patients. DCJS is not a formal member of the Task Force; however, the Coordinator provided information to the Task Force regarding FNE programs in the Commonwealth as needed.

4. Coordinate and strengthen communications among sexual assault nurse examiner medical directors, sexual assault response teams, and hospitals for existing and developing sexual assault nurse examiner programs.

The Coordinator met with hospital administrators and department managers across the state. The Coordinator is collaborating with DCJS staff working with Sexual Assault Response Teams (SARTs) throughout Virginia.

The Coordinator has provided technical assistance to both FNE programs and community-based sexual assault advocacy centers on building stronger relationships and creating policies and practices where advocates are automatically called in to the healthcare setting when a survivor presents themselves for a sexual assault forensic exam.

5. Provide technical assistance for existing and developing sexual assault forensic examiner programs, including local sexual assault forensic examiner training programs.

The Coordinator provided technical assistance to Valley Urgent Care in Harrisonburg as it developed a FNE program for both adults and pediatrics, providing resources and information as they developed treatment protocols. The Coordinator also advised and provided the necessary contacts to Valley Urgent Care, including the Virginia Victims Fund, the Virginia Department of Forensic Science, and their local SART.

The Coordinator sends out a monthly email communication to all the programs. These emails detail information pertinent to the practice of sexual assault forensic nursing.

- 6. Create and maintain a statewide list, updated biannually, to include the following:
  - a. A list of available sexual assault forensic examiners, sexual assault nurse examiners, sexual assault forensic nurse examiners, and pediatric sexual assault nurse examiners;
  - b. The location and facility affiliation of each examiner;
  - c. The duty hours for each examiner and affiliated facility for sexual assault exam services; and
  - d. The location of available local sexual assault forensic examiner training programs.

The Coordinator, in collaboration with the DCJS Criminal Justice Research Center, developed a survey for FNE programs that was first distributed in December 2021. The survey was again distributed in July 2022. This survey will be distributed annually and collects the data enumerated. From the data collected, the Coordinator has developed a map directory of all the programs in the state, as well as a list version of the directory. The survey also gathered additional information and data that aids in identifying needs and challenges with the programs.

The Coordinator distributes the directory regularly in the monthly email communication to FNE programs. Programs regularly communicate with the Coordinator on any changes that the program has undergone, so that the directory and information gathered by the Coordinator is regularly updated.

7. Coordinate, share, and disseminate the list created pursuant to subdivision 6 to the emergency operations communications system available to emergency medical services and law-enforcement agencies as well as the internal emergency and hospital communications system.

The Coordinator has shared and disseminated the directory with the enumerated agencies and entities.

8. Share and disseminate the list created pursuant to subdivision 6 with all other relevant agencies, including law-enforcement agencies, attorneys for the Commonwealth, victim-witness programs, sexual assault service organizations, the Virginia Department of Juvenile Justice, the Virginia Department of Social Services, the Virginia Department of Education, and school divisions.

The Coordinator shared and disseminated the directory with the enumerated agencies and entities. The directory also appears on the Sexual Assault Forensic Coordination Program web pages under the DCJS public facing website.

9. Create sexual assault nurse examiner recruitment materials for universities and colleges with nursing programs in partnership with the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia.

The Coordinator attended several presentations by other state coordinators on how they have created recruitment materials and trainings and presentations for nursing programs, as well as met with some programs individually. The Coordinator has begun to develop a presentation for nursing schools and is also exploring and reaching out to contacts at technical schools, which was a suggestion that came out of a meeting with the Virginia Chapter of the International Association of Forensic Nurses.

10. Support and coordinate community education and public outreach, when appropriate, relating to sexual assault nurse examiner issues for the Commonwealth.

The Coordinator met with representatives from Senator Kaine's office and the International Association of Forensic Nurses, at their invitation. The Coordinator presented the following in that meeting:

- The history of the Virginia Sexual Assault Forensic Examiner Coordination Program.
- The landscape of Virginia FNE programs, including the number of programs, the breakdown of hospital
  and stand-alone programs, the number of programs serving both adults and pediatrics, and the number
  of programs that serve adults or pediatrics only.
- Challenges to Virginia FNE programs, including sustainability of existing programs, large gaps in services, especially in rural areas, and costs.

The Coordinator attended the Office of the Attorney General's Sexual Assault Awareness Month Roundtable Discussion on April 20, 2023. The invitees included statewide organizations as well as local organizations that provide direct services to victims of sexual assault. Attorney General Jason Miyares, his Chief of Staff, Sexual Assault Kit Initiative (SAKI) staff, as well as other staff, hosted the event. The group discussed challenges in providing services caused by the pandemic, an increase in drug-facilitated sexual assault, challenges serving refugees and immigrants, and first responders and entry staff at hospitals not being trained in trauma-informed response. The group also discussed new strangulation legislation and the challenges with current rape/sexual assault laws in the *Code of Virginia*.

The Coordinator spoke at the Virginia Chapter of the International Association of Forensic Nurses annual educational conference and covered the following topics during the presentation:

- Code of Virginia mandates for the Sexual Assault Forensic Examiner Coordination Program.
- An update on the Virginia Sexual Assault Forensic Examiner Programs directory and map.
- An update on recent Virginia legislation pertaining to forensic nursing.

The Coordinator made a presentation on the Sexual Assault Forensic Examiner Coordination Program to a meeting of Virginia Child Advocacy Center directors.

The Coordinator was highlighted as a featured member for the International Association of Forensic Nurses, which appeared on their social media pages.

The Coordinator regularly provides updates to the Virginia Chapter of the International Association of Forensic Nurses. The Coordinator's monthly email also has an expanding list of recipients, as additional people reach out and request to receive the updates.

#### Recommendations

Given the vested interest that the state has in prosecuting sexual abuse of children and sexual assaults against adults, the Coordinator recommends:

- 1. Regular increases in the payment reimbursement rates to accurately reflect the actual and total costs of the sexual assault forensic exam.
- 2. Reimbursing programs through the SAFE Payment Program for forensic examiner time spent on court preparation and testimony.

In order to address the lack of knowledge, funding, and support for sexual assault forensic nursing and FNE programs from many hospital administrators/management, the Coordinator recommends:

- 3. Creating an advisory committee, in collaboration with the Virginia Hospital and Healthcare Association, tasked with:
  - a. educating hospital systems on sexual assault as a public health matter, why forensic nursing is an essential healthcare service, and how to create sustainable FNE programs in their hospitals;
  - b. updating the model and guidance documents for both adult and pediatric transfer and treatment of sexual assault patients, which should be reviewed and updated every 2–3 years; and
  - c. creating and updating written materials for distribution to sexual assault patients at the time of the forensic exam, to include the following information: reported sexual assaults, anonymous sexual assaults, the PERK tracking system, statutory time limits on the storage of the PERK, and what to do if you receive a bill for the sexual assault exam.


