

REPORT ON THE PASSPORT AND UNIFORM CERTIFICATE OF GENERAL STUDIES PILOT

NOVEMBER 1, 2022

A Report to the House Committees on Education and Appropriations and The Senate Committees on Finance and Appropriations and Education and Health

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OVERVIEW AND AUTHORITY

As part of the 2021 Appropriations Act, the General Assembly appropriated \$250,000 to support one-time pilot programs for school divisions to redesign their dual enrollment course offerings to align/link with the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies Pilot offered by Virginia's community colleges.

The Appropriation language outlining the requirements for the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies offered by Virginia's community colleges states:

Item 144 Paragraph VV

Out of this appropriation, \$250,000 the second year from the general fund is provided for grants to support one-time pilot programs to school divisions to redesign dual enrollment course offerings to align/link to the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies offered by Virginia's community colleges. Divisions awarded such grants shall collaborate with the local community college to effectively redesign the local school division's dual enrollment course offerings. Divisions applying shall include: (i) an explanation of why such dual enrollment pilot program is warranted; (ii) the dual enrollment courses currently offered by the division; (iii) the projected student enrollment in dual enrollment courses; and (iv) the number of the division's employed staff qualified to teach dual enrollment and the number currently teaching a dual enrollment course. The Department of Education may consider in the awarding of a grant: (i) the division's local composite index; (ii) the level of misalignment in the division's dual enrollment course offerings to the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies; and (iii) the division's level of dual enrollment course availability and current student enrollment in those courses. The Department of Education shall report, along with the divisions and community colleges, the components of the redesign and efforts to increase availability and participation in dual enrollment courses to the General Assembly by November 1, 2022. The Department of Education and the Virginia *Community College System shall use these pilot programs to provide a comprehensive* guide to every school division and community college to assist with aligning high school dual enrollment course offerings to the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies.

The appropriations language supports the development of greater access to early college and dual enrollment opportunities for students across the Commonwealth. Currently, there is varied opportunity for such access to students due to, for example, geographical and logistical access to institutions of higher education, student and family awareness of these opportunities, and an inability to provide coursework in a K-12 setting because of a lack of access to teachers with appropriate content credentials.

Providing greater access to the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies supports access to more rigorous and differentiated learning opportunities within the public K-12 setting.

SUMMARY OF APPLICATION PROCEDURES

The process of the application for passport and uniform certificate of general studies pilot was initiated through Superintendent's Memo (refer to the #300-21 memo. See Appendix) regarding this grant was posted on October 22, 2021 to the Virginia Department of Education's website.

Thirty-six school divisions applied for the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies Pilot offered. The total amount awarded was \$249,998.94, with individual awards ranging from \$2,212.38 to \$28,760.94. These awards varied by size according to a categorical distribution relative to the size of the school division.

SUMMARY OF SCHOOL DIVISION ALLOCATIONS AND EXPENDITURES

Efforts to redesign and increase availability to dual enrollment, as reported by school divisions, included:

- Providing coursework to existing content teachers, to acquire at least, the minimal of the 18 credit hours required to teach dual enrollment within the school building.
- Covering the costs of hosting informational events for families to consider the opportunity of enrolling in these programs.
- Use of funds to attract already credentialed teachers through bonuses or salary adjustments. This was a one-time opportunity through this grant that the school divisions will need to find funds to sustain before the scope of this grant.
- Employing part time faculty to provide instruction either in-person or virtually for just those courses. Virtual instruction was provided either synchronously or asynchronously. This was a one-time opportunity through this grant that the school divisions will need to find funds to sustain before the scope of this grant.

Of the 36 school divisions that submitted an application for Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies grant award, 15 school divisions expended all, or most, of the funds allocated; 21 school divisions did not expend any of the allocated funds. Among the various reasons for the lack of expenditure are the following prominent and most often stated reasons:

- The timing of the grant award was not ideal. Many of the school divisions, while believing strongly in the need and greater demand for this opportunity, faced challenges in recruiting teachers to take on extra coursework to be endorsed to teach these classes.
- In many cases, the school division personnel assigned to manage this grant and the generation of the program were either reassigned to other positions within the division or had left the school division.
- Many school divisions expressed a challenge in developing a partnership with an institute of higher education to provide either graduate level classes for teachers or program development for credit allocation to students. The greatest barrier was the challenge of developing an efficient partnership in such a short period.

- Some school divisions stated that their communities expressed a greater desire for dual enrollment opportunities in Career and Technical Education opportunities, which fall outside of the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies programs.
- Many school divisions expressed that the encumbrance due date on the grant funds was too short of a turnaround to develop the approach to support more students entering into the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies programs. Work was done and meetings were held in the development of these programs, but the timing to expend these funds was too far out in the turnaround time of this grant.

Information provided by school divisions in the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies programs is included in the summary table below. Greater detail on the programs and expenditures is found in the reports that were submitted by each school division (Appendix B).

CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies Pilot provides a vital boost for school divisions to develop greater opportunities for high school students to acquire Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies and more dual enrollment offerings. The prospect of providing more pathways into rigorous courses delivers a varied and diverse litany of learning options for school divisions.

While the support from the General Assembly in providing these funds to boost and upgrade dual enrollment offerings is necessary and greatly appreciated, both the timing and time constraints associated with this grant opportunity created the greatest challenge in the allocation and expenditure of the funds

Of the \$250,000 set aside for expenditure to develop Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies programs through this pilot, only \$95,989.30 was expended; as a result, \$154,010.70 will be returned to the General Fund.

Experiences from this grant opportunity will inform the Virginia Department of Education's ability to support school divisions that intend, and need, to implement Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies programs. Some experiences that may be incorporated into a comprehensive guide include:

- School divisions need to perform an environmental scan of resources before embarking on this process.
 - Schools need to assess the graduate level acquisition of existing staff and project the needs of supporting, via tuition reimbursement, the acquisition of necessary credentials to teach dual enrollment classes.
 - In the absence of available internal staff to acquire these credentials, school divisions need to develop sustainable plans of incentivizing the recruitment of teachers who can teach these courses. Such plans may come from teacher preparation programs, other school divisions, or from outside of the K-12 environment.
- School divisions need to perform an environmental scan of demand before embarking on this process.
 - School divisions need to assess whether the community has a desire for enrolling their children into these programs, as some communities may prefer the alternative opportunity to provide associates degrees or credentialed programs through Career and Technical Educational partnerships with community colleges.
 - In either case, when developing their dual enrollment opportunities, school divisions will need to develop an intentional infrastructure which will:
 - Provide families and communities with as much information about embarking upon this pathway, while being clear about opportunities, challenges and logistics they will encounter.
 - Develop a strategy to either support families with a sustainable program of paying for the dual enrollment credits, or develop a clear cost-benefit analysis for families when weighing up the costs of higher education.

• School divisions need to allow for changes in master schedule planning to accommodate the requirements of the community college's conditions to align with the school's structure.

The timing of this grant occurred at a time when school divisions are preoccupied with staffing challenges, addressing learning recovery needs, and meeting continued virtual learning choices by families may make this pilot appear unsuccessful. However, the grant opportunity is truly necessary and desired.

The recommendation from the Virginia Department of Education is to continue to support this pilot program, but to do so over an extended period of time with a smaller fund allocation. This recommendation in practice could include funding additional pilots at a rate of \$125,000 for fiscal year 2023, and the \$125,000 for fiscal year 2024. Another practical application of this recommendation would be to include funding to assist with the completion of Career and Technical Education credits toward an associate's degree.

Providing these or similar funding approaches under the grant, until a greater demand arises, would create a path for school divisions to persist in pursuing more differentiated and rigorous opportunities for students to excel, beyond the scope of traditional high school coursework. Such an incentive may drive long term programmatic changes at the school division and state levels, but would ultimately drive greater learning opportunities for all students in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FY 2022 DUAL ENROLLMENT ALIGNMENT GRANTS OCTOBER 2021

Beginning with the <u>Transfer Virginia (Transfer VA)</u> work across the Commonwealth, in conjunction with the development of the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies (UCGS), one important next step is to perform a thorough review of dual enrollment transfer program offerings and their alignment with the Passport and UCGS. Because dual enrollment is a partnership between the school divisions and community colleges, this collaboration is essential to meeting the needs of all students.

INTENT

The intent of the Dual Enrollment Alignment Grant (DEAG) is to provide public school divisions with funding to redesign dual enrollment transfer course offerings to align/link to the <u>Passport</u> and <u>Uniform Certificate of General Studies</u> offered by Virginia's community colleges. Divisions awarded such grants shall collaborate with the local community college to effectively redesign the local school division's dual enrollment course offerings.

BACKGROUND

Code of Virginia §23.1-203 requires the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia (SCHEV), in consultation with Virginia's public two- and four-year institutions, to develop guidelines for the creation of a "one-year Uniform Certificate of General Studies Program and a one-semester Passport Program to be offered at each comprehensive community college." This collaborative work resulted in the development of The Virginia Public Higher Education Policy on Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies Programs. The policy outlines the provisions of the Passport and UCGS programs and specifies that two-year colleges include both the Passport and UCGS Programs in dual enrollment agreements made with individual school divisions.

The Passport and UCGS Programs are 16-credit and 30- to 32-credit hour two-year college programs in which all courses are transferable and satisfy a lower-division general education requirement at any public institution of higher education, excluding Virginia Military Institute. Both the Passport and UCGS programs use structured course blocks representing broad general education categories. Each block is populated with

coursework that is designed to provide students with broad introductory knowledge of the subject matter. To earn the Passport or UCGS, students must satisfy the credit requirements in each block and complete all coursework with a grade of C or better. Transfer of Passport and UCGS coursework will not be through course-to-course equivalency but via a block transfer process where receiving institutions will "find a home" for the credits within their general education requirements. For the full policy, go to the Passport/UCGS policy.

The 2021 Special Session I General Assembly provided FY 2022 funding to support school division efforts to align dual enrollment offerings with the Passport and UCGS program.

2021 Appropriation Act Item 144

VV. Out of this appropriation, \$250,000 the second year from the general fund is provided for grants to support one-time pilot programs to school divisions to redesign dual enrollment course offerings to align/link to the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies offered by Virginia's community colleges. Divisions awarded such grants shall collaborate with the local community college to effectively redesign the local school division's dual enrollment course offerings.

INTENT

All Virginia public school divisions and regional programs with their own school board are eligible to apply for the Dual Enrollment Alignment Grant.

REPORTING

Each school division with a funded proposal will provide the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) with a final report by September 1, 2022. The report format will be provided at the time of award. Components of the report are included in the Required Scope of Work section (overview) and in Appendix A - Dual Enrollment Alignment Talking Points Guide (detailed).

After an informational webinar, school divisions will submit an Intent-to-Implement form that indicates the school division's agreement to collaborate with their serving Virginia Community College System (VCCS) college to effectively review and redesign the local school division's dual enrollment course offerings to align with the Passport and UCGS offered by Virginia's community colleges. The terms of agreement are outlined in the Required Scope of Work section.

Eligible applicants agreeing to implement the Required Scope of Work by submitting the Intent-to-Implement form will receive a minimum of \$600 per participating high school to support the work.

REQUIRED SCOPE OF WORK

Eligible applicants shall agree to:

- Collaborate with the staff of the serving VCCS college and stakeholders to compare alignment of offerings with the credit hours per block included in the Passport and UCGS and goals for students, using Appendix A <u>Dual Enrollment Alignment Talking Points Guide</u>.
- Provide a written report to the VDOE by September 1, 2022 that includes:
 - information regarding dual enrollment program offerings, projected enrollments, and staff;
 - key findings related to existing dual enrollment offerings and needs related to alignment with the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies offered by Virginia's community colleges;
 - timeline for implementation of necessary actions;
 - identification of responsible parties for each action;
 - Use of Funds Report that details all budget item expenses (a template will be provided upon grant award); and
 - the signature of division superintendent or designee and Virginia community college president or designee.

FUNDING PROCESS AND ALLOWABLE EXPENDITURES

Eligible applicants agreeing to implement the required scope of work by submitting the Intent-to-Implement form will receive a minimum of \$600 per participating high school to support the work.

Allowable expenditures for recipients include reasonable food, lodging/travel, materials, and costs associated with writing the required final report.

The <u>Dual Enrollment (DE) Collaborative Guide</u> provides details about the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies (UCGS) and a comprehensive look at how decisions to offer a course via dual enrollment can impact a student's higher education experience. All participants in the DEAG should first review the DE Collaborative Guide so that a base understanding is common across all participants.

Currently, Amelia County Public Schools does not have a natural science teacher for the Passport or UCGS. Amelia County is located in a rural community (bedroom to Chesterfield/Richmond) which can make it difficult to recruit teachers with a master's degree in specific content areas. At the present time, no additional compensation (monetary or extra planning) is offered to individuals to teacher or to retain those educators who teach higher level courses. Students have an opportunity to enroll in concurrent courses through Brightpoint Community College. Students could possibly take courses through Longwood University (29 minutes away but it is feasible). Virginia Virginia offers General Environment Science (ENV 121) beginning in the Fall of 2022 which could be taken to meet the Passport requirement. If ACPS could provide the Passport/UCGS Program to our students it would enable students living in a rural areas to receive help on college tuition expenses. Many of our students are first generation college students and this opportunity would assist in their goal. Under the new plan (unless staffing changes) ACPS will only be able to offer the Passport course requirements. ACPS cannot offer the UCGS due to not having enough qualified teachers/ teacher candidates to teach these courses. ACPS currently offers two courses that are not aligned with Passport/UCGS: BUS 100 Introduction to Business and BUS 200 Principles of Management. These two courses are offered to allow students an opportunity to receive additional college credits and give them a chance to explore a possible career interest. College credit loss is possible with these two courses if a student decides not to pursue a degree in Business or the four-year institution does not accept them as transfer elective courses.

- At this time, our AP courses are only accounting for about 30 students and we know that we have more students who are planning to pursue further education. We are missing the ability to help students begin higher education with the safety net of high school teachers and counselors being able to assist them as they begin.
 Course availability is not equitable within our county and students have the ability to take coursework at other schools but currently have to travel. This situation is not ideal and we need to be utilizing the resources available to make courses available

- Student High School Graduation Needs: As a small school with an enrollment of 185 students as of August 2022, in five grades (8th-12th) our courses must meet a multitude of high school graduation needs.
 - For example we used to offer Spanish I, II, & III as a virtual dual enrollment course to help meet our staffing needs – we do not have an in-person licensed Spanish teacher but the Transfer VA requirements did not allow all students who wished to seek an advanced diploma the opportunity to take the course. Therefore we had to seek other virtual provider options to meet the most need and high school graduation requirements.
- Teacher Preparation & Credentialing: We do not have many staff with master's level degrees specific to the coursework they teach – we do have a high number of teachers with a Masters of Education – we need to identify way to incentive the specialization of at least 18 credit hours in course-specific graduate level courses
 - This comes at a time when teachers are being asked to take on so much more, it is my hope that the VCCS and high school systems can determine a credentialing process for these teachers that is supportive and productive
 - Speaking with Dr. Ben Worth, this looks like a potential area of growth for both high school dual enrollment and associate degree pathways
 - Also at time when people are not entering the education field as a career program it is imperative that we seek some sort of teacher preparation support

Overlapping Coursework in our Dual Enrollment Program at BCHS

It appears that there are options to decrease the history and possibly the science course duplications. One example is that we can research credentialing processes within the VDOE to make required history courses more streamlined; i.e. to teach one semester of PLS135 to meet the Virginia US Government high school graduation requirement and replace the PLS 136 course with another Passport ready course like English 111 to meet that Block I specification in passport.

Council High School strives to provide students with opportunities to enroll in dual enrollment courses that are aligned to the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies. While the school is able to offer some DE courses onsite at the school, others must be offered virtually (synchronously or asynchronously) through Southwest Virginia Community College, the A. Linwood Holton Governor's School, or through linking CHS students virtually to courses at other division schools that are taught by DE-certified teachers. In addition, opportunities are available for CHS students to travel to the Buchanan County Career, Technology, and Higher Learning Center to participate in in-person DE courses not currently offered at CHS. Some dual enrollment courses previously offered onsite at Council High can no longer be offered due to current staffing shortages, which prohibits CHS from being able to offer all the courses in the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies in-person and on-site. The courses listed on this form are courses that are taught onsite at Twin Valley High School by division staff assigned to TVHS or courses that are offered virtually to TVHS students through Southwest Virginia Community College or the A. Linwood Holton Governor's School. It does not reflect courses taught by division staff at other division schools

There are currently qualified instructional staff assigned to Council High School who could teach Physical Geology (GOL-105), Historical Geology (GOL-106), Environmental Geology (GOL-110), and Introduction to Cultural Geography (GEO-210), but these classes have not been included in the schedule at this time due to the staffing shortage. Due to limited staffing, the teacher who is certified to teach these courses is currently assigned to teach other required courses and the school has been unable to adjust the schedule to include these DE courses at this time.

An analysis of the courses currently offered at the school shows that the D.E. courses that the school is currently able to offer align with the VCCS Passport Course Roster and the VCCS Uniform Certificate of General Studies Course Roster. There is a recognized need to increase the number of courses available to students and to provide more dual enrollment options to students in alignment with the Passport and UCGS; however, current staffing shortages have made this a challenge. Many students at CHS participate in virtual dual enrollment courses, and the school will work to provide these students with increased tutoring supports to better address the challenges presented by completing complex coursework in a virtual format without consistent onsite support from an instructor.

Please detail key findings related to existing dual enrollment offerings and needs related to alignment with the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies offered by Virginia's community colleges.

The above dual enrollment courses reflect courses that are currently available on-site at Grundy High School, either as taught by DE-certified division staff assigned to Grundy High School or as offered virtually to GHS students through Southwest Virginia Community College or the A. Linwood Holton Governor's School. Grundy High School students also have the option to take DE courses at the Buchanan County Career, Technology, and Higher Learning Center or to enroll virtually in DE courses offered by DE-certified division teachers assigned to other schools. Because of the close proximity of GHS to the Buchanan County Career, Technology, and Higher Learning Center, many GHS students elect to travel to the BCCTHLC to participate in additional DE courses available at that location. There is a need within not only Grundy High School but the school division as a whole to increase the number of DE courses available to students in line with the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies. Two primary findings or areas of need were reviewed relevant to the alignment of current DE offerings and the need for additional course availability: staffing availability and scheduling.

One primary need related to alignment with the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies is the lack of available staff at the school who are currently certified to teach DE courses within many of the blocks required by the Passport/UCGS. Course availability would be significantly improved if additional staff at the school were to become certified to teach DE classes within these blocks. However, as this requires additional coursework on the part of instructional personnel, the

time involved and the cost of the additional courses are factors that often impede staff from seeking DE-certification. It would be beneficial for the division to continue to look at ways to offer support to teachers who are interested in pursuing DE-certification, particularly in terms of funding sources that could be utilized to offset the cost of the necessary coursework. Students at GHS have the option to enroll in DE courses through Southwest Virginia Community College or the A. Linwood Holton Governor's School. This opens up many additional DE course offerings for students that are not available onsite at GHS. However, there are some challenges that frequently arise regarding virtual DE courses. Due to the complexity of most of these classes, some students struggle with the virtual format and with not having the instructor physically present, which can have an impact on the number of students who enroll in the courses. A student who would likely enroll in the course if it were offered in-person may choose not to do so if it is only available virtually. Providing additional opportunities for students enrolled in dual enrollment courses to receive in-person tutoring as needed, particularly during the afterschool program, would likely encourage more-students to enroll in these courses. In addition, it is important to ensure that students are fully informed of the Passport and UCGS and that their high school course schedules are developed accordingly.

Another key finding relates to scheduling challenges. In addition to the limited number of staff currently certified to teach DE courses, many staff who are certified to teach DE classes must also teach non-DE courses. This impacts their availability to teach DE courses and limits enrollment opportunities for students.

Currently, GHS offers limited DE courses within Block I and Block III on site, and GHS students have opportunities to participate in courses within the other blocks either through attending in-person classes at the BCCTHLC or through participating in DE courses virtually. Increased availability of on-site DE courses would likely positively impact the number of students enrolled in DE classes, although given the small staff size at the school, this likely is not feasible in the short-term. Ensuring that the DE classes that are offered are aligned with the Passport/UCGS is also crucial. Moving forward, it will be important for the school and the division to examine the availability – even if through virtual means - of an expanded slate of aligned DE offerings within the various blocks while also offering additional supports to students enrolled in these courses (especially if they are taking the classes virtually) to ensure that they are successful. The recent implementation of the CTE High School Innovation initiative within the division, in collaboration with Southwest Virginia Community College, is designed to increase the number of DE courses offered to students specifically relevant to health sciences and engineering career pathways. The division is actively working with the college to expand and enhance DE course offerings within these areas.

Key findings indicate that Hurley High School needs to add additional Dual Enrollment classes in line with the Passport and the Uniform Certificate of General Studies to the schedule. While students have an opportunity to take courses that are aligned with the Passport and the UCGS, in most cases, they must do so either virtually or by leaving their home school (HHS) to travel to the Buchanan County Career, Technology, and Higher Learning Center. This frequently poses challenges with scheduling, especially if a student must also take classes at their home school. While there are some teachers at the school who are certified to teach DE courses, particularly within Block IV and Block VI, Hurley High School has a small staff, and DE-certified teachers are also assigned to teach non-DE courses, which takes up the majority of their instructional day. The school actively encourages staff who are not currently certified to complete coursework necessary to become certified to teach dual enrollment classes, and will work with the division to seek out supports for teachers who wish to do so. The school currently has a certified teacher for Biology 101/102 who also certified for Chemistry, and the school hopes to offer that dual enrollment course onsite at HHS in the near future. The school would also like to have a dual enrollment English 111/112 teacher onsite.

While there are a number of DE courses aligned with the Passport and UCGS available to students virtually, many students experience challenges with completing high-level DE coursework in a virtual format during which the teacher is not physically present. This is particularly true for courses in Block

IV and Block V. The school will leverage resources with the afterschool program offered by the school to provide additional tutoring and remediation to students who need additional supports to be successful in dual enrollment courses.

It would be beneficial for the school and division to work further with Southwest Virginia Community College, the A. Linwood Holton Governor's School program, and with current teachers on staff within the division to expand the number of dual enrollment courses available to students, particularly in Block II (Art, Humanities, and Literature) and Block VII. Current offerings within these blocks are very limited division-wide. Available courses within Block II are especially limited, which makes it difficult for students to meet the requirement relevant to Block II.

The courses listed above are courses that are taught at Twin Valley High School, either in-person by division staff assigned to the school who are certified to teach Dual Enrollment courses, or offered to students on-site at the school in a virtual format with an online instructor through Southwest Virginia Community College or the A. Linwood Holton Governor's School program. Students attending Twin Valley High School also have the option to enroll in additional dual enrollment offerings available inperson at the Buchanan County Career, Technology, and Higher Learning Center or to take virtual dual enrollment courses taught by DE-certified BCPS staff who are based in other division schools. The courses listed on this form are courses that are taught onsite at Twin Valley High School by division staff assigned to TVHS or courses that are offered virtually to TVHS students through Southwest Virginia Community College or the A. Linwood Holton Governor's School. It does not reflect courses taught by division staff at other division schools to which TVHS students can connect virtually (those courses are identified on the DE Alignment form for those schools) or DE courses taught by division staff at the Buchanan County Career, Technology, and Higher Learning Center which are also available to TVHS students (those courses are listed on the form for the BCCTHLC). For the most part, DE course offerings are currently available to TVHS students that would enable them to meet the requirements of the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies. However, due to the school's small size and the overall small size of the entire school division, the array of DE courses currently available to students is somewhat limited in scope. Additional DE offerings would improve the overall alignment of current offerings with the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies and provide students with more DE course options based on their individual academic goals and interests. However, staffing is currently very limited and scheduling DE-certified staff to teach additional courses continues to be challenging.

In looking at the existing dual enrollment offerings and needs, it would be beneficial for Twin Valley High School to add onsite dual enrollment science classes such as BIO 101 and 102. However, in order to be able to add these classes, the school would need to add certified personal who would be able to teach BIO 101 and 102. It would also be beneficial to look at adding additional DE courses within Block II (Humanities/Art/Literature), Block IV, and Block VII. In addition to scheduling concerns, there is limited availability of division personnel who are certified to teach DE courses that align with the Passport and UCGS. Providing additional options and incentives for division teachers to become certified to teach DE courses, especially within blocks with limited course offerings, would broaden the range of courses available to students relevant to alignment with the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies.

Many students at TVHS are enrolled in virtual DE courses, either through Southwest Virginia Community College, the A. Linwood Holton Governor's School, or courses that are taught off-site at another BCPS school by certified division staff, to which TVHS students connect virtually. The school is able to offer numerous dual enrollment classes to students through these online formats. However, internet connectivity issues sometimes pose a concern at Twin Valley High School, which is challenging when students rely on the internet to access their dual enrollment courses. Given the small size of the school and the reliance on virtual formats to deliver instruction in many of the DE courses currently offered, looking at ways to improve the reliability of internet connectivity at the school would also be beneficial.

The Buchanan County Career, Technology, and Higher Learning Center offers a number of dual enrollment courses for students in Buchanan County. The courses are offered in-person to students from all four of the division's high schools. The DE courses that are offered are largely aligned with the Passport and Uniform Certificate of Graduate Studies, particularly within Block I, Block III, and Block V. Students have opportunities to take other DE courses within Block II and Block IV on-site or virtually at other division schools, as well as virtually through Southwest Virginia Community College and the A. Linwood Holton Governor's School. In addition, dual enrollment courses in cybersecurity and welding are also available at the BCCTHLC and provide students with course credit through Southwest Virginia Community College, though not necessarily aligned with the UCGS. It would be beneficial to add additional courses, particularly within Block II, Block IV, and Block VII. There is a specific need to incorporate additional course offerings in Block .[], and the division is currently looking to add CST 100 (Principles of Public Speaking) as one option. However, the current challenge is finding certified staff with the available schedule to teach the course.

Key findings relevant to DE courses offered at the Buchanan County Career, Technology, and Higher Learning Center in alignment with the Passport and UCGS reflect the need for an expanded slate of DE course offerings for students, as well as needs related to scheduling and staffing. The BCCTHLC offers an overall wider variety of in-person DE courses aligned with the Passport and UCGS than other division schools (particularly for Block V, with largely all of Block V courses taught at the BCCTHLC), meaning that students from the division's other high schools who wish to take these courses in-person must travel to the BCCTHLC each day in order to participate. However, this occasionally creates scheduling conflicts for some students; if a student needs a course that is offered at their home school but that is not offered at the BCCTHLC, that may impede their ability to travel to the BCCTHLC to participate in the DE courses offered there. In addition, because the students who are enrolled in DE courses at the BCCTHLC attend different home schools, this often creates scheduling conflicts relevant to activities at the home schools.

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Overview

Chesterfield County Public Schools (CCPS) seeks to provide the widest range of educational and career avenues possible to its students. To that end, CCPS remains committed to offering students the greatest possible number of advanced courses that will help them achieve their academic and career goals.

I. Institutional Profile

Goal and Mission of Dual Enrollment Program


CCPS has 11 high schools and a career and technical center with a total enrollment of 19,553 high school students for the 2020-21 school year. The CCPS dual enrollment program seeks to enhance students' college and career readiness by providing them with exposure to college level courses and the opportunity to acquire transferable college credit during their high school career. While the 11 high schools focus on general college education credits, the career and technical center dual enrollment program focuses on career readiness and certification programs. This profile reflects data compiled on the general education courses and does not include the career specific courses offered at the technical center.

Credentialed Teachers


Figure 1. Number of teachers credentialed in each discipline in each school.

The division currently has 96 teachers credentialed to teach dual enrollment courses: 31 teachers in English composition and literature, 22 in mathematics, 16 in social studies and 13 in science. The remaining 14 teachers are credentialled in world languages, art, music, fitness, and business. The distribution of teachers across the individual schools is shown in *Figure 1 (p. 3)*. All high schools have at least one, and usually multiple, teachers credentialed in English composition and literature. All but one school have one or more teachers credentialed in mathematics. Most have at least one teacher for social studies and one for science. Almost one-quarter of the teachers (23 out of 96) are at one high school (Cosby). The other schools have between five and 10 credentialed teachers on staff.

75 out 96 credentialed instructors will be teaching dual enrollment courses in the 2022-2023; a breakdown of credentialed faculty by school and course can be found in *Table 2 (p. 6)*.

Program Enrollment

CCPS had 2,332 students taking at least one dual enrollment course in 2019-20 and 2,517 students in 2020-21. These students were fairly evenly divided between grades 11 and 12, with a few grade 10 students. As shown in *Figure 2*, enrollment was varied among schools, with almost 54% of the students enrolled at Cosby, James River, and Midlothian.

A comparison of this data to the total high school DE enrollment in CCPS demonstrates uneven distribution compared to student population. *Table 1* looks at CCPS high school enrollment (column A) and the number of students taking at least one DE course at each high school (column B). If students taking DE courses are equally distributed across the schools, the percent of DE students enrolled in a school (column E) should be the same as the percent of CCPS DE students in that school (column D). The data shows that a few schools have a large proportion of overall CCPS DE students. Column C serves to provide context to the additional data points by showing each school's percentage of overall CCPS HS students.

Students Graduating with Dual Enrollment Credits

Of the students graduating with DE credit, most graduated with fewer than 15 credits. Over the last two school years, approximately 70% of the students had less than 15 credits, 25% had 15-30 credits, and 5% of students acquired 30 or more credits. Seven graduated with an associate's degree. *Table 2* shows the complete breakdown for each school.

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II. Assessment of Current CCPS DE Offerings

In the past three years, CCPS has offered a total of 30 college-level courses in at least one of each of its 11 high schools. These courses and relevant data are described in *Table 3*. All of these courses, except for HLT 116, currently fulfill requirements for one or more of the pathways to the Passport, UCSG, or Associate's Degrees.




Figure 3: Three year average enrollment for DE courses offered at each high school

The highest-enrollment courses in the past three school years have been ENG 111/ENG 112 (College Composition 1-2) with an average of 1340 students, MTH 161/MTH 162 (Precalculus 1-2) with an average of 681 students, and HIS 121/HIS 122 (United States History 1-2) with an average of 649 students (*Figure 3*). Enrollment in DE courses varies after this, with most courses' enrollment numbers in the double digits. The three-year average enrollment is skewed in some cases, as not all courses have been offered every year in every school.

III. Passport/UCGS Alignment Plan

Process

Each CCPS high school created an alignment plan based on its own student population, including likely student interest and qualifications of its current faculty. *Table 5* reflects the DE courses which were included in at least 4 of the 11 high school alignment plans, as well as all courses that will be offered in any of the 11 high schools during the 2022-2023 school year.

Course Offerings

While course offerings in each of the Passport and UCGS blocks are already offered in CCPS, no single school currently offers courses in all seven blocks. The only course offered in the building at all 11 high schools is ENG 111/112. The only additional course in which students from all 11 high schools are enrolled is HIS 121/HIS 112; some students take this course on campus, while others take it online. Currently, the course offered as distance learning are BIO 141/142, FRE 201/202, HIS 121/HIS 122, HLT 110/HLT 116, MTH 154/245, MUS 101/MUS 121, and SPA 201/SPA 202.

DE-Credentialed Faculty

The most populous course, ENG 111/ENG 112, has 1,337 students enrolled for 2022-2023 and 31 credentialed faculty. The second most populous course is MTH 161/MTH 162, which has 788 students enrolled for 2022-2023 and 20 credentialed faculty. The third most populous course is HIS 121/HIS 122, which has 779 students enrolled for 2022-2023 and 12 credentialed faculty. The rest of the DE courses in 2022-2023 have 10 or fewer CCPS faculty credentialed to teach them.

Analysis of Data

When comparing the alignment plan reports from individual schools with the summary, it is clear that there is a correlation between DE enrollment and available credentialed staff. Of the 96 credentialed faculty in the county, all but a few are teaching a DE course. With very few exceptions, if a school has at least one teacher credentialed to teach a course, the school offers that course and has students enrolled. *Table 4* shows the correlation between credentialed teacher availability and student enrollment. This is evidence that there will be student interest in DE courses in whichever building they are offered.

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IV. Discussion

Strengths

Every high school offers DE courses in written communication and mathematics and has faculty credentialed to teach DE composition and literature courses. All but one high school has a teacher credentialed to teach mathematics. Throughout CCPS, 31 faculty are credentialed to teach composition and literature, and 22 are credentialed to teach mathematics. These areas cover blocks I, II, and V. CCPS has a deep and stable rosters of teachers throughout its high schools who can teach these courses presently and in the future.

Enrollment and student interest in current DE course offerings is a strength. During the 2020-2021 SY, 2517 students took DE courses in CCPS, and among 2021 graduates, just over 500 CCPS graduates earned more than 15 credits through DE courses.

Challenges

Recruitment of faculty who can meet Brightpoint Community College's credentialing requirements can be a challenge. Few Virginia colleges and universities welcome visiting teachers who need specific graduate courses to meet credentialing requirements. CCPS high schools have a need to obtain credentialed faculty in areas beyond writing, literature, and mathematics through hiring and credentialing members of the current faculty. In particular, credentialed social studies and science teachers will be needed, as some schools lack or have only one faculty credentialed in those areas. This creates program volatility; if the only credentialed staff member in that subject leaves, it jeopardizes the availability of those courses. Currently, CCPS has 16 credentialed social studies teachers and 13 credentialed science teachers. Tuition reimbursement funding across disciplines is often limited.

While overall interest in DE in CCPS remains high, DE enrollment varies from school to school. Three high schools (Cosby, James, River, and Midlothian) account for 55% of all DE students in the county. Providing both guidance about DE and increased DE opportunities throughout all the county high schools will be necessary so that every student has equal access to the VCCS Passport and UCGS.

Several schools indicated that students and parents would need to be well informed regarding the difference between DE and Advanced Placement (AP) courses. For example, students may not realize that taking a DE English course (6 credits) versus an AP English course (3 credits with a qualifying AP score) could have a significant impact on a student's ability to complete the UCGS while in high school. Consistent communication about student pathways and school courseling support throughout the course selection process will be needed to ensure students interested in obtaining a UCGS certificate are enrolled in the correct courses to do so.

Course Alignment and Passport/UCGS

The alignment plan includes 5 college courses which do not currently fulfill Passport or UCGS requirements: BIO 141/BIO 142, which does fulfill requirements for an Associates Degree in health sciences; CST 131(paired with a semester of CST 103, which *does* fulfill a Passport and USGS requirement for Block II); and HLT 110/HLT 116, which will fulfill a Passport and USGS requirement starting in SY 2023-2024. CTE courses offered include ITD 110/ITD 210, ITN 154/ITN 155, ITE 221, BUS 100/BUS 200, and LGL 110/125. In most cases, two semester courses are paired to complete a full one year of high school credit. Whether credits will be lost on transfer will depend on the student's planned course of study and the policies of the institution the student transfers to.

Opportunities to Collaborate

CCPS currently offers five DE courses through distance learning, synchronously and asynchronously. CCPS will evaluate the feasibility of expanding this program to include synchronous courses in which the DE teacher works only with remote students, hybrid synchronous courses in which the DE teacher has both remote and in-person students in the classroom, and asynchronous courses through the CCPS Online program. Students may also earn credit by taking courses directly from Brightpoint through concurrent enrollment. Additionally, BCC refers credentialed faculty to teach online, asynchronous courses in subjects that cannot be offered by full-time, high school faculty.

Recommendations for Changes

The committee finds that CCPS and its high schools are in position and desire to offer all students the opportunity to begin earning the Passport and/or UCGS, provided that they do the following:

- Find credentialed faculty who can teach courses in blocks III, VI, and VII. CCPS and schools have two avenues to find credentialed faculty. They can specifically recruit individuals with the credentials to teach such courses or offer ways for current high school faculty to become credentialed to teach DE courses. CCPS will be offering such credentialing opportunities for English and mathematics instructors through the University of Richmond and Radford University this fall (2022). Similar credentialing opportunities are being considered in History and Science starting in 2023.
- Have high schools work collaboratively so that virtual concurrent classes can be offered at one school and taken by students at another school. Such offerings would help with the first recommendation as high schools can essentially share a credentialed instructor (see "Opportunities to Collaborate," above).
- Provide clear outlines and plans for students as to what is required of them to earn a VCCS
 Passport and/or UCGS. If students know their options as early as 9th and 10th grades, they will

be better able to complete the Passport and UCGS required courses. Providing this information to students and parents can assist in resolving any potential conflicts between AP and DE courses by helping students become aware of the opportunities that the different courses offer, and support students in selecting the courses that will help them meet their goals.



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1.Please detail key findings related to existing dual enrollment offerings and needs related to alignment with the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies offered by Virginia's community colleges.

- Northern Virginia Community College (NVCC) provided the approved UCGS course list and Manassas Park High School (MPHS) administration and counseling team were able to cross reference teacher credentials with what could be offered. MPHS has offered English 111 and English 112 for several years. Challenges remain in having properly licensed staff to teacher UCGS Dual Enrollment courses at Manassas Park High School.
- MPHS will continue to work with NVCC to look for opportunities for NVCC staff to teach UCGS Dual Enrollment courses at MPHS, whether in person or virtually. There was discussion on MPCS providing transportation for MPHS students to attend classes at NVCC.
- MPHS has Early Online College funds that could be used to cover tuition and textbook cost for UCGS Dual Enrollment courses.
- There was joint interest in pursuing a pilot cohoit of students in IT who would take classes on the NVCC campus or participate synchronously. While the IT coursework would not align with the Passport, it could provide a gateway and interest for future courses that would be aligned with Passport/UCGS.
- MPHS has a CTE teacher who is certified to teach Dual Enrollment courses in Marketing and Business. While his courses are not aligned with UCGS, they are popular courses, count for credit at NVCC, and help to increase overall interest in dual enrollment courses at MPHS.

2. Please provide a timeline for implementation of necessary actions; be sure to include the identification of responsible parties for each action.

- Based on the approved list, MPHS is going to investigate if the following courses could be taught in the future: Introduction to Theatre, US Government and Politics, General Biology I, Quantitative Reasoning, US History to 1877 or 1865, and Principles of Public Speaking. (HS Administration to cross reference these courses and their respective required teaching credentials with current staff certifications—Fall 2022/Winter 2023).
- MPHS staff will promote the Passport and UCGS programs among high school students. Counselors will continue to encourage qualified students to enroll in dual enrollment courses (Winter/Spring 2023).
- MPHS administrators will continue to recruit teachers who are also qualified to teach dual enrollment (Spring 2023).
- Should it occur again in Summer 2023, MPHS staff will promote NVCC's Jumpstart program. Jumpstart includes several UCGS courses.

 MPHS will continue to include courses in the Program Pathways (Attachment #5 of Dual Enrollment Agreement) that meet with requirements for completion of the UCGS (Ongoing).

Support from RCC

MCPS has a solid complement of DE courses in partnership with RCC and we should communicate this with our community. Our students have opportunities that will prepare them for post-secondary education. We will need to continue to support our complement of teachers in part by using the IREPO Grant. Our math teacher is currently using the IREPO grant to secure 18 credit hours post Masters in content area.

RCC has also provided information on sonography and patient care which may be a dual enrollment opportunity. Other opportunities include aquaculture, phlebotomy, and cyber security.

RCC Navigator, Juwan Waddy, supports students who are taking DE courses at MCPS and to help students take courses at RCC that are not available at MCPS. He is a resource to help students while at MHS and to transition to secondary education. Continuing communication with students and families regarding the Navigator is important.

RCC is available to support the DE teachers with planning and assessments to ensure the level of rigor.

Communication

The importance of communicating with parent(s)/guardian(s) regarding the rigor of dual enrollment and the commitment needed to be successful in dual enrollment courses is noted. We can do that early in middle school and in 9th and 10th grade so students have a strong foundation for success.

Dual Enrollment Alumni can be relevant to this process to speak to our current MHS students on post-secondary expectations. Encouraging them to enroll in a dual enrollment course and communicating with them the strategies for success is critical to the success of the program.

In April, Opportunities night at the high school will showcase BCTC, DE, and CBGS to allow students to investigate the courses.

Alignment

We can align our course offerings in 9th and 19th grade to support our students taking DE courses. English Honors is effectively pre-dual enrollment. Identification and selection of the students is important in order to support the rigor of the course.

There should be on-ramps and off-ramps for students to engage in dual enrollment courses. Selection is not meant to gate keep, but to help prepare students to be successful in higher level courses. An application process with criteria will be developed to identify students who would be successful in Honors 9 English.

Rigor

Students and families should have an understanding of the course sequence and the habits of mind to prepare for dual enrollment courses beginning in middle school. This is a priority to our DE program.

Students need long-term projects and college level assessments embedded within the dual enrollment course in order to prepare them for post-secondary work. Assessments that mirror those in college should be a part of the DE courses taught at MHS.

At all levels we need to continue to promote students' independence and grit, and to help them to become life-long learners.

Based on a review of documents, and focused meetings with Norview High School, the following bulleted findings were identified. These items have been targeted for support and action for the Passport program and the Uniform Certificate of General Studies (UCGS).

- Norview High School has worked to expand the dual enrollment offerings for their students. For several years, English has been the main course offered at this school and others. Within the past three years, Norview has served as a pilot site for the onboarding of new dual enrollment courses. For SY 2022-23, the available courses for students will include English 111, English 112, History 121/122, Math 161 (Precalculus), and Biology 101. Interested students may also take a virtual government course with TCC or ITE152 (information technology) via distance learning. Those taking these courses will be assisted by a dual enrollment mentor at their high school. Students will be supported with the required instructional materials for these courses.
- As with other schools, Norview has worked to secure dual enrollment credentialed teachers across different content areas. As reported, this school now has four in-building teachers who have been credentialed by Tidewater Community College. This includes the disciplines of English, Math, History, and Science.
- In addition to dual enrollment, Norview offers advanced placement courses. Strategies will be
 implemented to support students with accessing the best opportunity for them. This will allow
 the Passport and UCGS programs to flourish for interested students without sacrificing any

Based on a review of documents, and focused meetings with Maury High School, the following bulleted findings were identified. These items have been targeted for support and action for the Passport program and the Uniform Certificate of General Studies (UCGS).

Overview

- Over the past three years, Maury has offered dual enrollment to students in the areas of English and Information Technology. Specifically, English has been the more populated class with a doubling in student enrollment for SY 2021-22 and projected enrollment for 2022-23. For SY 2022-23, History 121/122, Math 161 (Precalculus), Government 135/136, and Biology 101 will also be available via the virtual learning format for interested students across the division. An effort is underway to increase dual enrollment student numbers across all content areas.
- As with other schools, Maury continues to work to secure dual enrollment credentialed teachers across different content areas. As reported, this school has one in-building teacher who has been credentialed by Tidewater Community College (TCC). This includes the discipline of English. Due to a change in course requirements, Maury's information technology teacher is no longer credentialed. Students will now take this course via distance learning with another high school serving as host.
- In addition to dual enrollment, this school has an advanced placement program. Often, this can
 impact the growth of one over the other depending on available resources, including staff.

Based on a review of documents, and meetings with Lake Taylor High School, the following bulleted findings were identified. These items have been targeted for support and action for the Passport program and the Uniform Certificate of General Studies (UCGS).

Overview

- Lake Taylor high school (LTHS) is committed to offering an array of educational options and opportunities for students. During the past three years, LTHS has offered dual enrollment in the areas of English and/or Information Technology. During this time, Lake Taylor experienced lower-than-expected dual enrollment numbers. It is noted that this school has a smaller student population in comparison to several other high schools within the division. Traditionally, this school has offered dual enrollment in English 111 & 112. Initially, Lake Taylor was the first to pilot dual enrollment within the area of information technology. However, over the past several years, this was not offered due to staffing and enrollment. For SY 2022-23, information technology has been reintroduced to the master schedule via distance learning. For SY 2022-23, the available courses for students will include English 111, English 112, History 121/122, and ITE 152 (Information Technology). Interested students may also take a virtual government course with Tidewater Community College (TCC). Those taking these courses will be assisted by a dual enrollment mentor at their high school. Students will be supported with the required instructional materials for all courses. A focused effort is underway to increase dual enrollment student numbers across all content areas at Lake Taylor High School.
- As with other schools, Lake Taylor continues to work to secure dual enrollment credentialed teachers. As reported, there is one in-building teacher who has been credentialed by Tidewater Community College for English. Distance learning will be utilized to create additional options for students at this school.
- Lake Taylor has been working to support the dual enrollment and advanced placement programs at their school. Often, having both could impact the growth of one over the other depending on available resources. Strategies will be implemented to support students with accessing the best opportunity for them, including dual enrollment. This will allow the Passport and UCGS programs to flourish for interested students without sacrificing any programs. Dual enrollment information will be shared with the entire student population.
- Across the school division, strategies of support are being implemented to increase the number of
 students who enroll in and successfully complete dual enrollment courses within the Passport and
 UCGS. Dual enrollment mentors have been identified as a measure of support. A dual enrollment
 point of contact has also been identified within the school's counseling office. Technology and
 other instructional materials have been secured as support.

Institutional Profile:

Freedom High School is a Title I school in Woodbridge,VA., where 84% of our students report a first language other than English and over 75% of all families are economically disadvantaged. The goal of Freedom High's dual enrollment (DE) program is to maximize student potential by providing equitable exposure to post-secondary opportunities. Freedom is unique in that it has four Specialty Programs. Prince William County Schools (PWCS) defines a Specialty Program as a program that is subject-specific or career-specific in nature. The Specialty Programs at Freedom High School are: The Center for Environmental and Natural Sciences (CENS), Pharmacy Technician, Medical Coding and Billing, and Junior Reserve Officers Training Corp (JROTC). The courses required for these Specialty Programs align with courses required for the General Studies, Health Sciences Specialization Associate of Science (AS) degree at Northern Virginia Community College (NOVA).

Currently, Freedom has four faculty members credentialed to teach DE courses through NOVA. Current courses offered at Freedom include ENG 111: College Composition I, ENG 112: College Composition II, BIO 101: General Biology I, BIO 102: General Biology II, HIS 121: United States History to 1877, and HIS 122: United States History Since 1865. Photography I will also be offered beginning in 2022.

2. Please detail key findings related to existing dual enrollment offerings and needs related to alignment with the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies (UCGS) offered by Virginia's community colleges.

Some challenges that Freedom faces to offer students the required courses for the Passport and UCGS are credentialed faculty.. That challenge can be met by offering students classes through Early Online College (EOC) and NOVA JumpStart. In addition, Freedom can focus on the recruitment and hiring of teachers with credentials needed to teach DE courses through NOVA.

Teachers of DE classes would benefit by forming a Collaborative Learning Team (CLT) with other schools across the Division. A CLT would give teachers the opportunity to share strategies, build relationships, and ensure all DE courses follow the same PWCS and NOVA guidelines. Work has already begun to form this CLT for DE teachers.

Currently, Freedom has four teachers credentialed to teach transfer-level DE courses. Those courses include ENG 111 and 112; BIO 101 and 102; HIS 121 and 122; and Photography I. No changes need to be made to align Freedom's DE program with the Passport and UCGS. Securing teachers with credentials to teach DE will be a priority. During recruitment and hiring, Freedom will focus on teachers with credentials that fill the DE gaps in math, behavioral/social sciences, and humanities. One course taught at Freedom, Photography I, is not a requirement in the Passport or UCGS but can be used to satisfy elective credits.

Rockbridge County High School (RCHS) in partnership with Mountain Gateway Community College (MGCC) has utilized the FY 2022 Dual Enrollment Alignment Grant (DEAG) to assess and align the current DE program and course offerings with the Uniformed Certificate of General Studies (UCGS) and Passport program.

The RCHS Mission Statement "Rockbridge County High School encourages its students to develop intellectually, socially, and physically, so that each student will become a contributing citizen to our school, community, nation, and global society." Illustrates the standards and opportunities for students who successfully complete DE courses.

Rockbridge County High School is located in rural southwestern Virginia. The focus for the RCHS Dual Enrollment (DE) Program is to offer a variety of College Transfer and Career Technical Education (CTE) courses that provide college credit options for students who pursue continued education at 4 year universities as well as those pursuing Technical Skills training to enter the workforce. This variety of DE course offerings address the various industries needs in the RCHS and MGCC service area.

The DEAG offered the opportunity to assess the current RCHS DE curriculum and to develop a strategic plan to address any areas where opportunities for improvement exist. During the assessment of the number of current DE course offerings, the number of faculty credentialed and currently teaching transfer level DE classes, and CTE faculty were assessed. The breakdown in Table 1.are categorized by the Passport, Uniformed Certificate of General Studies (UCGS) and CTE requirements.

The current courses were found to be in alignment with the Passport, UCGS guidance and paring guide. RCHS DE Assessment and Alignment Summary

The RCHS DE program assessment offered insight into several challenges and opportunities to align the DE program with the UCGS guidance for transfer credits. The DE program assessment suggested that RCHS needs more credentialed faculty to facilitate an expanded DE program. RCHS would like to expand the DE course offering and currently requires teachers credentialed to teach Passport and UCGS aligned classes such as, Psychology, Pre-Calculus I, Biology, Art, British and American Literature, Forestry, and additional Cybersecurity courses.


Several of the expanded RCHS CTE program offerings would not align with the UCGS or Passport guidance and would fall outside of the 30 DE credit program. However, local industry and skilled employment opportunities align with the addition of these courses. These credit would not be lost if the student transferred into MGCC's current programs such as Electrical and Instrumentation. Forestry Management, extensive IT programs, and Culinary Arts. These programs are generally 1 to 2 year programs that result in industry recognized credential, certificates, and Associates degrees. The RCHS DE student would benefit from the variety of UCSG transferable courses and the CTE courses.

The strategic plan of action has involved RCHS staff representatives, DE teachers, and MGCC staff and instructors. This collaborative effort has produces several goals to ensure the alignment to UCGS guidance and employment opportunities for RCHS students.

The strategic plan includes:

- Develop a plan for a 30 credit offering at RCHS to align with UCGS requirements. This step has been completed by MGCC and the file is attached to the DEAG Final Report submission.
- The RCHS DE instructors have had 2 meeting to discuss DE course offerings and DE course content requirements as identified by Virginia Community College Systems policies and guidance.
- 3. In partnership with MGCC the current RCHS DE teachers have identified willingness to obtain education to further credentialing in key courses. RCHS is exploring grant funding that would assist DE teachers to obtain and meet the current VCCS requirements of 18 course credits in the specified subject matter.
- A strategic plan of action has been developed to incorporate DE education and awareness in coordination with the RCHS School counseling office, RCHS students, and DE teachers at RCHS.

The DESG grant has provided an opportunity to expand the RCHS DE program to meet the needs of RCHS students, identify industry requirements, and align the DE course offering to benefit our students. The development of the strategic plan has strengthened the partnership with MGCC and RCHS and supports the RCHS DE mission statement. Rockbridge County has a critical need for need for federal, state, and local funding to continually improve the opportunities available to RCHS students.

Shenandoah County Public Schools would like to increase the number of dual enrollment opportunities offered to students. In the 2021-2022 school year, approximately 50 percent of SCPS students were identified as economically disadvantaged. Offering dual enrollment courses at a reduced tuition rate provides equity in participation for all students. Shenandoah County Public Schools has a need to increase credentialed instructors in Block I (Written Communication), Block II (Humanities/Art/Literature) and Block IV (Natural Sciences) to provide student opportunity and alignment to the Passport and Uniform Certificate of General Studies. Currently, students who are working toward the Passport or Uniform Certificate in General Studies must take courses on campus or online through the local community college due to the lack of dual enrollment opportunities. Additionally, the increase in credentialed instructors assists in the retention of courses due to vacancies in DE courses and flexibility in scheduling.

Sussex County Public Schools (SCPS) has students enrolled at Brightpoint Community College completing credentialing programs, two students attend classes at Brightpoint and others attend classes offered at Rowanty Technical School. SCPS has five students attending Richard Bland Middle College Program. The courses taken at Richard Bland College are not listed as they are only offered to the students admitted into the program. The inclusion of these classes would increase our course offerings.

Sussex County Public Schools is limited in the number of in-house dual enrollment course offerings for students. This review has demonstrated that Sussex County Public Schools must place a stronger emphasis on expanding its Passport aligned course offerings for students.
