A Rich & Complex Narrative

Petersburg is a community that has a rich history and a promising future! Petersburg certainly has a complex narrative, balancing its historical significance with contemporary challenges. The community's rich history is reflected in its architecture, culture, and local stories, but the issues of crime, food insecurity, and access to resources and jobs are pressing concerns that affect many residents.

Petersburg Data

According to Census Data, the population of Petersburg is approximately 33,261. Of this number, 21.8% of residents hold a bachelor's degree or higher. Census data indicates that 22.2% of the population lives below the poverty line. This number is more than double the number for VA, and 1.5 times higher than the national rate. Data also indicates that Petersburg is in the 12th percentile for safety, meaning 88% of cities are safer and 12% of cities are more dangerous.

PCPS Data

At PCPS, our mission is to develop 21st-century citizens able to effectively collaborate, communicate, and innovate! Our division is comprised of 7 schools and approximately 4,178 students. The districts minority enrollment is 100%. Also, 72.7 of our students are considered economically disadvantaged.



Community Builders PCPS Grant Goals



The vision for the execution of the Community Builders Grant in PCPS is to utilize family engagement, community partnership, and collaborative leadership to create alternatives that will positively shift our cities data, while improving our lives of our students and their families.





While Community Builders grant funded activities are open to all students and families, the data of 8th grade participants are a key focus of our data analysis efforts. By July 2025, at least 100 PCPS families will have increased their skills and knowledge of relevant parental and community information, resources, and services as measured by survey assessments.

By July 2025, PCPS will have established and maintained 25 community partnerships aimed at enhancing educational opportunities and resources for students. Progress will be tracked through quarterly meetings and documented partnership agreements, ensuring alignment with our district's strategic plan to foster community engagement and student success.



Overall Participation Data




Event Date
