Agriculture and Forestry Industries Development (AFID) Fund Program Summary

AFID Facility Grant Program

As of December 31, 2024, there were 134 active or completed AFID Facility Grants successfully awarded since the inception of the program, supporting a variety of agriculture- and forestrybased economic development projects across 70 unique Virginia localities. These projects, which total over \$12.8 million in AFID grant funds awarded, represent over \$1.624 billion in new capital investment, the creation of 4,229 new jobs, and nearly \$1.5 billion in new Virginia-grown agriculture and forestry purchases. These agribusinesses have, on average, committed to purchase approximately 80 percent of the agricultural and forestry products needed to meet their new value-added processing requirements from Virginia farms and forestland owners.

For the first half of fiscal year (FY) 2025, a total of \$820,000 was committed in AFID Facility Grant funds to assist six new and expanding projects in the Commonwealth, which represents the commitment of more than \$97.7 million in new capital investment, 189 new jobs, and nearly \$44 million in new Virginia-grown purchases. These companies committed to purchase an average of 55 percent of the agricultural and forestal products needed to meet their new value-added processing needs from Virginia producers. As of this report, there are nine 9 AFID Facilities Grant projects in the pipeline. If awarded, these projects could represent more than \$1.36 million in AFID funds. Additional details on these projects can be found below under Future Trends.

AFID Planning Grant Program

Since the inception of the AFID Planning Grant program, \$1.1 million has been awarded to 58 active or completed projects, directly impacting 67 unique localities. Of the funded projects, 53, approximately 90 percent, have successfully completed the grant.

Two new AFID Planning Grant projects were announced during the first half of FY 2025, with an award totaling \$29,800.

As of this report, staff has received several AFID Planning Grant program project inquiries that could potentially lead to approximately \$130,000 of funds being awarded.

AFID Infrastructure Grant Program

The AFID Infrastructure Grant offers reimbursable grants of up to \$50,000 to political subdivisions to fund community infrastructure development projects that support local food production and sustainable agriculture. Since the inception of the AFID Infrastructure Grant program in 2021, \$1,224,216 has been awarded to 42 active or completed projects, directly impacting 33 unique localities.

The fall 2024 grant round opened on October 1, with applications due by November 15. Staff received eight applications from eight different localities with a total request of \$ 364,071. These applications are currently being reviewed, and announcements are expected by the end of February.

AFID Blue Catfish Processing, Flash Freezing, and Infrastructure Grant Program

The AFID Blue Catfish Processing, Flash Freezing, and Infrastructure Grant Fund was established by legislation enacted during the 2023 Session of the General Assembly authorizing the Governor to award grants from the Fund to encourage efforts by political subdivisions to support the processing, flash freezing, and infrastructure of invasive blue catfish species. Any funds awarded by the Governor must be awarded as reimbursable grants of no more than \$250,000 per grant to political subdivisions to support blue catfish processing, flash freezing, and infrastructure projects. Unlike other AFID grants, this is the only grant that does not require local matching funds. It is also the only AFID grant specifically dedicated to a particular industry and eographic portion of the Commonwealth.

The 2024 grant round opened in October and ran through the end of November. Three applications were received with requests totaling \$750,000. A single applicant, Amory Seafood of Hampton, Virginia, was selected to receive the full \$247,000 award. Several localities have expressed interest in applying for future grant rounds but were unable to complete the application before this round closed.

Future Trends

The AFID program is a critical economic development tool in supporting new and expanding agriculture- and forestry-based businesses, oftentimes supporting small businesses who would not otherwise qualify for state discretionary incentives. The program continues to receive strong interest from businesses representing controlled environment agriculture (CEA), specialty foods and dairy manufacturing, meat processing, craft beverage, and forestry products. Indoor farming project leads continue to be steady as Virginia continues to be a leader in CEA. Food and meat processing also continue to have strong interest, with projects spanning from small local producers to large industry leaders. Forestry has also seen an uptick in project leads representing sawmills and bio char operations. A steady interest remains in the program from the craft beverage industry representing hard cider, wine, and distilled spirits.

Agricultural technology companies continue to have strong interest in the AFID program. However, these companies do not meet the AFID program requirements for consideration. Staff recommends review and consideration for expanding the AFID program to allow support of the growing ag-tech sector.

The AFID Facility Grant project pipeline currently has nine active projects across eight unique localities. These projects, which represent CEA, forestry, craft beverage, and meat processing industries, represent over \$619 million in new capital investment, the creation of 1,030 new jobs, and commitments to purchase nearly \$140 million Virginia-grown agriculture and forestry products. If awarded, these projects could represent more than \$1.36 million in AFID funds.

Several of these large projects have announced slower than expected due to longer than normal timing to finalize project financing, which staff believes is due to the current economic climate. As of this report, staff is beginning to see a positive trend in lead generation, which is expected to bring several new active projects to the pipeline in the first quarter of 2025.
