

# Radford University Two-Year College Transfer Grant Update May 1, 2025

#### **Requirement:**

Per Item 142 paragraph F.4.d of the 2023 Special Session Amendments to the Appropriation Act, Radford University is required to report on the progress of achieving targeted goals for the Two-Year College Transfer Grant Program. In accordance with the mandate the following response is provided.

### Response:

Radford University remains deeply committed to supporting the Two-Year College Transfer Grant Enhancement (CTG) program and strengthening transfer student enrollment. Under the leadership of President Bret Danilowicz, Provost Bethany Usher, and Vice President for Enrollment Management Dannette Gomez Beane, the University has seen remarkable results. In fall 2024, Radford welcomed 752 new transfer students—a 39% increase over the previous year and the largest transfer cohort since 2013.

This growth reflects the University's continued efforts to provide accessible and affordable pathways for transfer students. A key initiative this year was the introduction of direct admission for students with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher. Admitted students who met financial eligibility criteria—an Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) of \$100,000 or less and a Student Aid Index below \$15,000—were able to access the Radford Tuition Promise. This program covers full tuition costs and aligns closely with the CTG eligibility requirements, enabling students to stack both funding sources for maximum affordability.

Radford also ranks second statewide for its high rate of Transfer VA curriculum pathway filings. These structured transfer pathways clearly map Virginia Community College System courses to Radford University's degree requirements, offering students transparent and efficient routes to degree completion.

In fall 2024, Radford launched the **Tartan Transfer Program**, a strategic partnership with eight Virginia community colleges. Spring 2025 marks the first semester of program implementation, with over 30 students already declaring interest. Participants benefit from personalized academic advising, access to student services and campus activities, career preparation resources, and scholarship opportunities—all starting while they're still at their community college.

To further support this initiative, the University created the **Tartan Transfer Advising Coordinator** role. This position is dedicated to helping community college students complete their associate degrees—a key requirement for CTG eligibility. Early indicators suggest that more students are now choosing to remain at their community colleges until completing their associate degrees, improving their chances of qualifying for CTG funding.

In 2024, Radford served 18 students through CTG resources. A detailed chart of CTG utilization and total program enrollment is appended at the end of this document.

To ensure eligible students receive the CTG, Radford University employs a comprehensive outreach and support strategy that includes:

- Offering both virtual and in-person workshops (individual and group) to assist students in completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and securing a valid Student Aid Index (SAI).
- Promoting CTG in conjunction with the Radford Tuition Promise to raise awareness among students and families.
- Dedicating staff to early advising interventions to encourage associate degree completion.
- Sending personalized outreach emails to potentially eligible students.
- Providing one-on-one counseling throughout the CTG awarding process.

The following tables provide a detailed summary of students receiving the Two-Year College Transfer Grant, CTG PLUS Grant, and CTG Incentive Grant since each program's inception. Please note that financial aid data for the 2024–25 academic year are not finalized until October; therefore, all projections (\*) are subject to change pending final validation.
