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RE: Education Improvement Scholarships Tax Credit Program – Report of Scholarship Foundation for Fiscal Year 2024

Dear Chair Lucas and Chair Torian:

Pursuant to Section 58.1-439.27 of the *Code of Virginia*, the Virginia Department of Education ("the Department") is required to report to the Chairs of the Senate and House Finance Committees the list of scholarship foundations that received donations for which tax credits were issued under the *Education Improvement Scholarships Tax Credits Program*. This report is based on donations that were made during the twelve-month fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023 and ending on June 30, 2024.

During FY 2024, there were a total of 36 scholarship foundations approved by the Department participating in the *Education Improvement Scholarships Tax Credits Program*. Of the approved scholarship foundations, 34 received qualified donations for which tax credits were issued during fiscal year 2024. A total of 5,820 scholarships were awarded.

The following table shows the number of tax credits issued for eligible donations and the total number of scholarships issued in FY 2024 as reported by the approved scholarship foundations. Under Section 58.1-439.28 A. of the *Code of Virginia*, scholarship foundations must disburse at least 90 percent of donations they receive during the twelve-month period ending on June 30<sup>th</sup> by the following June 30<sup>th</sup>. As a result, the number of scholarships issued during FY 2024 may include scholarships funded from donations made in the prior year.
