Sales Highlights

September sales overall were up nearly 23% compared to last year, from the national Powerball jackpot that grew to an advertised \$1.8 Billion (3rd highest in history) for the drawing on September 5 and the continued strength of iLottery digital games. Retail sales were up \$16.1 million (+8.5%) compared to September 2024. For the year to date, total sales are up more than 17% in the first quarter.

Profit Highlights

September profits totaled \$93.0 million, up 28% compared to last year. For the year to date, profits of \$224.6 million are \$2.0 million more than FY25, with first quarter profits strongly bolstered by the Powerball jackpot run. Retailers continued to earn nearly 6% of sales from commissions and incentives, including cashing bonuses for the high volume of prizes won and redeemed at licensed retailer locations throughout the Commonwealth. The Lottery's operating expense rate remains at a low 4%.

Other Highlights

In addition to a special meeting to consider the license application for the Norfolk casino, the Board held a regular business meeting to review and consider updated forecasts of sales, profits and transfers to the Lottery Proceeds Fund. The Board's recommendation was forwarded to you this week. We look forward to our continued participation in the Commonwealth's annual revenue forecast process.
