## **Community Builders PCPS Grant Goals**



The vision for the execution of the Community Builders Grant for SY 25-26 in PCPS is to continue to utilize family engagement, community partnership, and collaborative leadership to create alternatives that will positively shift our cities data, while improving our lives of our students and their families.





While Community Builders grant funded activities are open to all students and families, the data of 8th grade participants are a key focus of our data analysis efforts.



By June 30, 2026, at least 200 PCPS families will have increased their skills and knowledge of relevant parental and community information, resources, and services as measured by survey assessments.



By June 30, 2026, PCPS will have established and maintained 25 community partnerships aimed at enhancing educational opportunities and resources for students. Progress will be tracked through quarterly meetings and documented partnership agreements, ensuring alignment with our district's strategic plan to foster community engagement and student success.




By June 30, 2026, at least 35 students will have participated in the afterschool and summer Community Builders experience.

## **Family Engagement University**

Families learn how to navigate and influence their child's education.










## **Overall Participation Data**
