EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The VDH Naloxone Distribution Program distributes opioid antagonists, such as naloxone, and harm reduction test strips to eligible entities and individuals across Virginia at no cost to the eligible entities. Due to limited resources, VDH prioritizes distribution of no-cost naloxone and test strips to populations that are at high risk for witnessing or experiencing an opioid overdose, including people who use drugs (PWUD), family members, friends, and people who work directly with PWUD. VDH also distributes naloxone to organizations to maintain on site to be used by staff in the event of a suspected opioid overdose.

Chapter 725 of the 2025 Virginia Acts of Assembly - Item 277 J mandates that the Virginia Department of Health maintain a list and report on organizations that submit requests for and receive opioid antagonists through its distribution program. The report is to be submitted to Chairs of the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Resources, House Health and Human Services Committee, Senate Finance and Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Resources, and Senate Subcommittee on Health, and the Chair of the Virginia Opioid Abatement Authority, and is to be submitted quarterly.

The report contains program data for the Naloxone Distribution Program for the period of October 1, 2025 – December 31, 2025. A summary of opioid antagonist orders is included below; a list of all orders received, and orders shipped is included in Appendix C.

FINDINGS

During the period of October 1, 2025 – December 31, 2025, VDH received requests from 175 unique organizations for a total of 46,693 opioid antagonist kits. During the same period, VDH shipped a total of 46,693 opioid antagonist kits to 175 organizations. Additionally, VDH shipped a total of 73 opioid antagonist kits to individuals during this time period.

INTRODUCTION

OPIOID ANTAGONIST DISTRIBUTION MANDATE

Chapter 725 of the 2025 Virginia Acts of Assembly - Item 277 J mandates that the Virginia Department of Health maintain a list and report on organizations that submit requests for and receive opioid antagonists through its distribution program. The report is to be submitted to specific Virginia House and Senate Committee Chairs and the Chair of the Virginia Opioid Abatement Authority and is to be submitted quarterly (Appendix A).

REPORT OUTLINE

This report contains a summary of opioid antagonists requested and quantities of opioid antagonists shipped to partners for the period of October 1, 2025 – December 31, 2025. A list of all orders received, and orders shipped is included in Appendix C.

BACKGROUND

Opioid antagonists are medications used to rapidly reverse the effects of an opioid overdose. These medications work by blocking the effects of opioids, including heroin, fentanyl, and prescription opioid medications. When used in time, they allow an individual who is experiencing opioid overdose to resume breathing, potentially saving their life. There are several different types of opioid antagonists currently available for purchase. Prior to 2024, VDH distributed only naloxone nasal spray 4mg product to all partners. In 2024, VDH began distributing intramuscular naloxone (January) and naloxone nasal spray 8 mg (September) to select partners that expressed preference for these formulations. Additionally, Virginia's 2024 state budget included \$1,000,000 allocated for the purchase of naloxone nasal spray 8mg. Prior to the distribution of naloxone nasal spray 8mg, VDH conducted extensive conversations with partners, harm reduction experts, and other states to promote a smooth rollout of the new product. VDH seeks the most competitive pricing to purchase naloxone at the lowest available cost, which allows VDH to purchase a greater quantity of naloxone for a reduced budget.

For the reporting period October 1, 2025 – December 31, 2025, VDH distributed the following products as part of the Naloxone Distribution Program:

- Naloxone nasal spray 4 mg – generic formulation (shipped in 2-dose kits – each kit contains a total of 8 mg of naloxone).
- Naloxone nasal spray 4 mg – Narcan (shipped in 2-dose kits – each kit contains a total of 8 mg of naloxone).
- Naloxone nasal spray 8 mg – Kloxxado (shipped in 2-dose kits – each kit contains a total of 16 mg of naloxone).
- Intramuscular (IM) naloxone (shipped in 1-dose vials – each vial contains 2 mg of naloxone).

The following types of entities are eligible to apply for an agreement and request opioid antagonists from VDH:

- Authorized comprehensive harm reduction sites (CHRs),
- Community services boards (CSBs),
- Community organizations that have high levels of interaction with people who use drugs and their friends and family,
- Correctional facilities,
- First responders (law enforcement agencies, fire service organizations, licensed EMS agencies),
- Local governments,
- Local health departments,
- Public institutes of higher education,
- Public K-12 school divisions, and
- Recovery and rehabilitation facilities.

Generally, VDH provides organizations with the quantity of opioid antagonists they have requested in the formulation that they have requested. Reasons that an organization might not receive the quantity requested include:

- Organization describes an intended use for opioid antagonists that does not align with priorities outlined in Virginia’s Naloxone Distribution and Saturation Plan.
- Organization does not possess a controlled substance registry license, which is required for organizations receiving IM naloxone.
- Organization has not demonstrated capability for managing separate inventories of over-the-counter naloxone nasal spray 4 mg alongside prescription naloxone nasal spray 8 mg, which is required for organizations receiving naloxone nasal spray 8 mg.
- Temporary shortfall of product due to a delay in receipt from vendor; in some cases, this means that an order may be split and shipped on several different days.

FINDINGS

During the period of October 1, 2025 – December 31, 2025, VDH processed requests from 175 unique organizations for a total of 46,693 kits of opioid antagonists. During the same period, VDH shipped a total of 46,693 kits of opioid antagonists to 175 organizations. Additionally, VDH shipped a total of 73 opioid antagonist kits to individuals during this time period.

Chart 1 includes a summary of opioid antagonist orders received by the Naloxone Distribution Program, disaggregated by organization type, as well as orders shipped, during the relevant time period. Many organizations order opioid antagonists to distribute to high-risk clients and community members and some order opioid antagonists to place in strategic locations for use in the event of a suspected overdose. Note that Chart 1 summarizes all orders with intended ship dates in Quarter 2 (October 1, 2025 – December 31, 2025), even if the order was placed in Quarter 1 (July 1, 2025 – September 30, 2025). During Quarter 2, all organizations received the quantity of opioid antagonists that they requested.

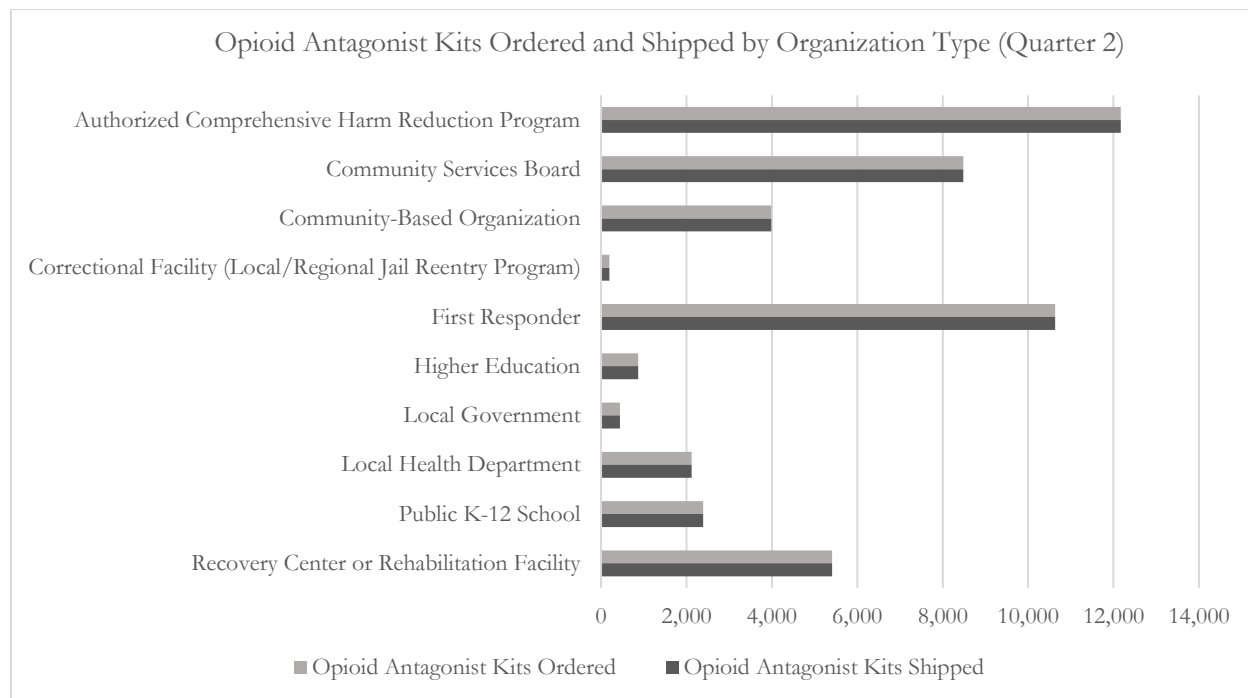

CONCLUSION

The VDH Naloxone Distribution Program had a productive quarter, managing 253 naloxone requests and distributing 46,693 opioid antagonist kits to 175 organizations across the Commonwealth. The Naloxone Distribution Program will continue to leverage available funds to maximize naloxone distribution to organizations conducting opioid abatement efforts in the Commonwealth. Current funding is expected to meet existing and anticipated needs in the coming quarter.
