At the direction of Virginia Code § 23.1-401.1(D), this Annual Report on Free Speech is submitted prior to December 1, 2025. Christopher Newport has developed and published materials and policies regarding constitutionally protected speech under the First Amendment of the United States Constitution. 

There have been no complaints filed in a court of law since December 1, 2024, to initiate a lawsuit against the University or a University employee for an alleged violation of the First Amendment of the United States Constitution.
